604 North 1st Street Jackson Ward Old and Historic District

Project Description:

Construct wood fence with brick piers around the rear yard.

The applicant requests approval to enclose the rear yard with a wood fence with brick piers at this brick dwelling in the Jackson Ward Old and Historic District. The proposed fence has a total height of 8 feet, with wood fence panels at 6.5 feet tall between the 16"x16" brick piers. The design is similar to a fence on the opposite block face. The fence will extend 46' from the rear of the structure, and will have a metal overhead roll gate for access at the rear.

Staff recommends approval of the project with conditions. The *Guidelines* state that new fences should be constructed using materials and designs appropriate to the district and rear yard fences should mimic traditional fence designs (pg.76, #4, #7). A fence of a similar design is found across the street from the building.

Staff has some concerns that the proposed overhead roll gate is not a gate type typically found in the Jackson Ward Old and Historic District. However, no details of the proposed gate were provided. <u>Staff recommends the design of the proposed gate be a simple wood gate rather than the metal gate proposed, the design to be administratively reviewed by staff.</u> In addition, the site plan indicates that a shed will be installed in the rear yard. As details of the proposed shed have not been provided, <u>staff recommends a separate application for the shed be submitted for Commission review.</u>

It is the assessment of staff that, with the conditions noted above, the application is consistent with the Standards for Rehabilitation and New Construction outlined in Sections 30-930.7(b) and (c) of the City Code, as well as with the *Richmond Old and Historic Districts Handbook and Design Review Guidelines,* specifically the page cited above, adopted by the Commission for review of Certificates of Appropriateness under the same section of the code.
