The Maggie L Walker Initiative Citizens Advisory Board shall be composed of sixteen members, including seven members appointed by the mayor, eight members appointed by the Council and a Human Services Manager.

The mayor shall appoint members from each of the following categories:

- (a) Four persons who, at the time of appointment, reside in a census tract within the city of Richmond with a poverty rate of at least 25%. At least one of the four persons shall, at the time of appointment, be a tenant of the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority or a recipient of Section 8 housing vouchers from the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority;
- (b) A representative of a service provider assisting low-income individuals or families;
- (c) A representative of a community organization or advocacy group with a primary focus on the reduction of poverty and who resides within the city of Richmond;
- (d) A person who resides within the city of Richmond.

The Council shall appoint members from each of the following categories:

- (e) Four persons who, at the time of appointment, reside in a census tract within the city of Richmond with a poverty rate of at least 25%. At least one of the four persons shall, at the time of appointment, be a tenant of the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority or a recipient of Section 8 housing vouchers from the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority;
- A business owner or a representative of a business with a workforce made up of employees, the majority of whom reside in the city of Richmond;
- (g) A representative of a college or university located within the city of Richmond with expertise in studying poverty or in program evaluation;
- (h) A person who resides within the city of Richmond;
- (i) A member of the City Council, who shall be a non-voting member of the board and shall serve as co-chair.

One member shall be selected from the staff of the city's Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities. One member shall be selected from each of the nine Councilmanic Districts of the City, with each such member to be a resident of the Councilmanic District nominated by the Council member representing such Councilmanic District fail to nominate a resident of the Councilmanic District within 90 days of a vacancy, whether created by the expiration of a term or otherwise, in the seat assigned to that Councilmanic District, any Council member may nominate a resident of any Councilmanic District to fill such vacancy.



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

By Resolution No. 99-R46-80, adopted March 22, 1999, the Council increased the number of commissioners from five to seven as authorized by section 36-11 of the Code of Virginia (1950). Resolution No. 2010-R140-162, adopted October 25, 2010, increased the number of commissioners from seven to nine with the addition of a Council-appointed seat and an additional tenant representative seat.

Pursuant to section 36-11 of the Code of Virginia (1950), no commissioner of the Authority may be an officer or employee of the City. By Resolution No. 2003-R230-2004-R18, adopted January 12, 2004, the Council established a procedure to be followed for appointing one member living in public or assisted housing to serve on the Authority's Board of Commissioners as required by the regulations of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development. This resolution was further amended by Resolution No. 2010-R141-173, adopted November 8, 2010, which revised the process of appointing the tenant representatives to the board.


