Amendment of the FY18 Special Fund Budget to appropriate \$750,000.00 from

the Virginia Department of Corrections to a newly created Sheriff's Special Fund

ORD. OR RES. No.

PURPOSE: Authorizing the City Administration to accept current and future requests for Out-Of-Compliance State Responsible inmates' off-site medical charges reimbursement from the Virginia Department of Corrections. These funds would then be submitted to the current Medical Services Provider who has incurred these costs. The amount of these actions should not exceed \$750,000 annually.

REASON: The Richmond City Sheriff's Office has an all-inclusive inmate Medical Services Contract that covers all inmate medical care with the exclusion of medications. The Medical Services Provider pays for all off-site medical needs of the inmates that are in the Sheriff's Office physical care. When an inmate becomes an Out-Of-Compliant State Responsible inmate and is still in the Sheriff's Office custody, any off-site medical care the Medical Services Provider has paid for can be requested from the Virginia Department of Corrections. The Virginia Department of Corrections, however, can only pay for those inmates medical charges to the Richmond City Sheriff's Office. By authorizing the acceptance and then the issuance of those funds to the current Medical Services Provider, the Sheriff's Office can promote the working partnership and ensure all available credits to the inmate Medical Services Provider can be utilized.

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RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that these types of funds and actions be accepted.

BACKGROUND: In the past across the state, the Virginia Department of Corrections would pay an inmate Medical Services Provider for Out-Of-Compliance State Responsible inmates directly to that provider. The Virginia Department of Corrections has since changed its processes thereby requiring the Sheriff's Office to request and accept those reimbursements intended for the inmate Medical Services Provider.

FISCAL IMPACT / COST: There should be no fiscal cost to the City of Richmond.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: There is no known fiscal impact in the City's status, bond rating or debt capacity.

BUDGET AMENDMENT NECESSARY: Yes. Amendment to the FY18 Special Fund to create a Special Fund for these actions. Having a Special Fund for this is also much more easily tracked and monitored as they effect multiple fiscal years.

REVENUE TO CITY: Currently, there is a proposed invoice to be sent to the Virginia Department of Corrections in the amount of \$293,796.44. This same amount would then be remitted to the current inmate Medical Services Provider who incurred those costs. This is an on-going cost that the Sheriff's Office would bill to the Virginia Department of Corrections on behalf of the current inmate Medical Services Provider.
