When I was a law clerk in Fairfax County, I distinctly remember one case. A teenage defendant, who had been convicted of larceny numerous times, appeared before the Court for sentencing. The judge she appeared before was known as a tough sentencer. Her attorney explained that she was adopted from Eastern Europe in elementary school, struggled to learn English, and was removed from her high school after she was raped by MS-13 and sent to an alternative school because that was the only way the County could protect her. The young woman explained to the Court that she was addicted to drugs and wanted drug treatment instead of jail time. The story was horrific and the Court took mercy on her—placing her into an intensive drug rehabilitation program and gave her a suspended sentence. I am not sure what happened to the teenager, but I do know that trying to get her the help she needed was a proper use of the criminal justice system. Ever since that sentencing hearing, I have wanted to get more involved in issues surrounding criminal justice in my local community.

Although incarceration is just one important aspect of the criminal justice system, programs that rehabilitate individuals are vitally important as well—they make communities stronger. As a former law clerk and employee in the top law enforcement agency in Virginia—the Office of Attorney General Criminal Appeals Division—I have seen both the benefits of helping individuals stay out of active incarceration and the results of the cycle of incarceration. I think my perspective as a criminal law attorney and my research, writing, and persuasion skills would be advantageous on this committee.





In 2016, as co-director of the Richmond-based documentary media firm, Field Studio, I produced a 52-week web series titled "Richmond Justice." Each week, the project revealed interviews and portraits of individuals in Richmond whose lives are shaped by the justice system. Those profiled included Commonwealth's Attorney Mike Herring, Chief of Police Alfred Durham, Mayor Levar Stoney, Sheriff C.T. Woody, and several dozen other, much less recognizable names -- professionals at nonprofit organizations working on alternatives to incarceration, public defenders, parents of incarcerated men and women, formerly incarcerated individuals, and one man currently serving time. Each interview shared the individual's own words; this wasn't a work of journalism, but rather documentation. The goal was to reveal a system, often difficult for the public to see, through the perspectives of the people who shape justice in Richmond every day.

Through my work on Richmond Justice, including through organizing a mayoral debate -- the only one to focus exclusively on the justice system -- I learned much. It was inspiring to meet many dedicated professionals determined to reform the nature of the City's justice system. They showed me that the potential for change is real, but requires daily effort -- and leadership.


