1. What motivated you to apply for appointment to Richmond's City Planning Commission, and what do you hope to accomplish by your participation?



4. What planning challenges or issues do you see facing the city of Richmond in the next decade?

NAME:

The balance between creating great places for great jobs for our citizens and creating a transportation infrastructure to and from those places they live is key to creating a great city. The diversity in modes of transportation over the next ten years will affect how we plan the "what goes where" piece. Reaching out to millennials and generation Z to ask them how they wish to live in 2027 and beyond will help us make decisions that will keep natives here and continue to attract those from other counties and cities from around the country. Planning cannot simply create a guide, it must be an intuitive, active, ongoing process that anticipates and acts. Having said that, we must anticipate the need for racial/socio-economic change in our city. We must understand that as we move forward to a time when people no longer see color or financial status when choosing where they live, it will be up to us to create opportunities for the market to craft atmospheres that accommodate how those who come after us wish to live.

5. The review of planning matters tends to be more "shades of gray" than strictly "black or white". This involves balancing objective standards (i.e. laws and regulations) with subjective design criteria such as determining what the appropriate massing, bulk, and/or compatibility, etc., with an area should be. How comfortable are you in making subjective decisions based on an objective set of criteria?

The art of real estate development is creating a concept that lives within a set of constraints known as laws. I have been doing this for my entire professional life. I once judged a state-wide middle school political science fair. One of the questions we judged was simply this, "If you are elected do you vote according to what your constituents want or what you know to be right in your own opinion?" This question is similar. The answer is that one must take all the evidence into account before rendering a decision.



1. What motivated you to apply for appointment to Richmond's City Planning Commission, and what do you hope to accomplish by your participation?

Thank you for your consideration of my application to serve on Richmond's City Planning Commission. I was motivated to apply for appointment to City Planning Commission to serve the residents of our wonderful city and contribute to the *Richmond 300* planning process, the update of our city-wide Master Plan. Serving on City Planning Commission requires the ability to work with a variety of people including developers, elected officials, public servants, and citizens. I have ten years of professional experience as a planner, who has worked with elected officials, planning commissioners, public servants, and citizens. My ten years of professional planning experience as well as my relationships and knowledge of City Hall make me a strong candidate for appointment to City Planning Commission. I intend to serve the residents of Richmond to the best of my ability as a member of City Planning Commission.

2. What are the three most important issues you will have to address as a member of Richmond's City Planning Commission, and how would you address them?

The three issues I will balance as a member of Richmond's City Planning Commission are equity, economic development, and environment.

- Equity: Richmond's concentrated poverty weighs heavy on me. I will approach each project considered by the City Planning Commission with the well-being of my fellow residents in mind. I will oppose projects that are detrimental to communities, especially our most vulnerable communities, and champion projects that contribute to an equitable future for all residents of our city. I will champion our public spaces and alternative modes of transportation, specifically bicycle and pedestrian connectivity and our public transportation system.
- Economic Development: Richmond's population is growing and it is strategic to leverage investments associated with this growth. I welcome public and private investments in the city that meet demands for housing, public facilities, and infrastructure that support our growing population. Private development generates jobs and tax revenue and can contribute to improved public amenities, such as public spaces and transportation infrastructure. I am a proponent of redevelopment and dense residential and commercial development around nodes of transportation, such as future GRTC Pulse stops. I am a proponent of redeveloping underutilized parcels of land, especially surface parking lots.
- Environment: Richmond is situated on the banks of the James River, the source of our drinking water and a variety of outdoor recreation activities. I will review each project considered by the City Planning Commission with our natural resources in mind. I will oppose projects that are detrimental to our natural resources, especially projects that contribute to the degradation of water quality in the James River and its tributaries. I will

work with the Department of Public Utilities to ensure proposed development mitigates stormwater pollution to its fullest potential.

3. How do you see the role of the public in the planning and design review process, and how can better public participation be achieved?

Public participation in the planning and design review process is of the utmost importance. Successful planning and design review processes effectively engage citizens and stakeholders. I have organized and participated in numerous public meetings as a professional planner and citizen. Participation in the planning and design review process can be ensured by organizing and attending neighborhood meetings. Engaging residents by holding meetings in their neighborhoods is a strategy for increasing public participation.

4. What planning challenges or issues do you see facing the city of Richmond in the next decade?

The number one challenge facing the City of Richmond in the next decade is population growth. Richmond's population is growing, which creates demand for housing, public facilities, and infrastructure. It is critically important for the City of Richmond to plan for continued population growth and meet the needs of its residents. The future of our city depends on a successful *Richmond 300* planning process and I intend to be an active contributor throughout the process.

The number one issue facing the City of Richmond is its old public school facilities. New and renovated public school facilities are planned across the city. As a member of City Planning Commission I will ensure these projects are thoroughly reviewed and considered in an expeditious manner.

This involves balancing objective standards (i.e. laws and regulations) with subjective design criteria such as determining what the appropriate massing, bulk, and/or compatibility, etc., with an area should be. How comfortable are you in making subjective decisions based on an objective set of criteria?

The City of Richmond benefits from robust planning documents like its city-wide Master Plan, Downtown Master Plan, and Richmond Riverfront Plan. These documents and ordinances guide development in the city. I will make informed decisions based on planning documents, laws and regulations, guidance from public servants at City Hall, and input from residents as a member of City Planning Commission



As a member of the Planning Commission I will have the opportunity to give back to the City that has given me so much and to contribute to the forward trajectory the City has been on for a number of years. My background and passion for city planning is another motivating factor for applying. As a fairly recent retiree, I am anxious to take on a new challenge. I am involved in a number of volunteer activities. As a member of the Planning Commission I hope to play a role in the "smart" growth of our City while balancing competing interests and needs. Help could be reserving a certain percent of housing units in a large project to be "affordable" or the developer could contribute dollars to the Affordable Housing Trust Fund who can then provide grants to entities such as the Better Housing Coalition, Habitat for Humanity and the Maggie Walker Community Land Trust. My approach would be to develop and provide various options in finding ways to ensure that all have a decent place to live.
- <u>Guiding City development</u>. The Planning Commission plays key roles in directing how the City develops and in protecting neighborhoods and the environment; as well as the aesthetics of the City via its role in the Master Plan process, historic preservation, public art and public facilities. As a growing City, all of these items will be in front of the Planning Commission accompanied by the expected differences of opinions of citizens and special interest groups. My approach is to listen; identify goals and points of agreement before working on addressing differences of opinion. I prefer to break problems into small components and work through them in a "work session" type environment. At all times one must respect all opinions
- 3. <u>Preserving neighborhoods</u>. A significant responsibility of the Planning Commission is to make recommendations that revolve around making exceptions to existing zoning. I see zoning as a

"promise" to adjacent and nearby land owners of how their neighbors may use their property. When a land owner requests an exception to zoning, my approach would be to listen to neighbors and the Planning Staff and consider public safety in order to determine what if any negative impacts there would be. Working with my colleagues on the Planning Commission we would need to consider the level of and reasons for any objections and ask if there is a compelling reason to approve the exception.

3. How do you see the role of the public in the planning and design review process, and how can better public participation be achieved?

The role of the public in the planning and review process and their participation is dependent on the significance of the initiative/project. For instance, a project that primarily impacts a particular neighborhood requires input from neighborhood leaders (To include City Council member.), neighbors and the neighborhood association. This can be done by first approaching neighborhood leadership and working with them on developing a public participation plan. The plan may include print and social media as well as open meetings at local venues such as libraries, schools and churches. As noted in Question Number 2 above, my approach would be to listen; identify goals and points of agreement before working on addressing differences of opinion. Break problems into small components and work through them in a "work session" type environment.

For larger scale projects that are of interest to a wider portion or all City residents, the methods noted above for neighborhood size projects must be employed only on a larger scale. Seek feedback from local experts on the project. (For instance, representatives from the art community must be part of a public art initiative.) Include as part of public input, a setting that allows small groups/individuals to provide input so those who may be less inclined to speak in large setting have an opportunity to do so. In some situations, a Charrette exercise on site or nearby is an excellent means to achieve public participation in a fun and meaningful way.

The bottom line: we must be open and proactive in obtaining feedback via multiple means and sources. A public participation plan must be part of the planning and design review process. That plan must be customized to the initiative/project.

I am very comfortable in working with and making decisions that must balance objective standards and subjective criteria. I understand context and the importance of evaluating a situation that has both objective and subjective components. I did this for nineteen years as the Director of a State Agency. As a decision maker I approached situations keeping in mind that to the constituent I was working with, their "problem" or request was very important to them and they deserved my respect and serious consideration. This approach allowed for frank dialogue and a better understanding of all sides of the situation. We developed a set of questions to ask ourselves and to consider in evaluating a situation that required balancing objective and subjective criteria. The questions provided a good way to ensure we were conducting a comprehensive review.

The fact there is a process for allowing "exceptions' to laws and regulations is recognition that subjective criteria must be considered in decision making. It is so important to know why objective standards are in place when viewing the subjective components. Knowing the "why" will allow you to balance the objective with the subjective – to keep within the spirit and intent of the objective standards.



2. What are the three most important issues you will have to address as a member of Richmond's City Planning Commission, and how would you address them?

Among its other responsibilities, the Planning Commission is charged with adopting the master plan. This is a wonderful time for an enthusiastic planner to join the Commission- the Richmond 300 planning effort has kicked off, and the energy around visioning and public involvement is high. The Commission members can capitalize on this by closely following the plan as it is developed and taking opportunities to provide meaningful input where appropriate. Adoption of a long-term master plan is a serious and exciting commitment, and as a certified planner, I will provide credibility and an academic planner's perspective to the process.

Another issue facing the Commission is the prevalence of the "shades of gray" decisions referenced in Question 5. Rules exist for a reason- in this case, the zoning "rules" are arguably the most powerful tool the City has in its toolbox to ensure orderly growth. Special Use Permits (SUPs), rezonings, Conditional Use Permits (CUPs) and Conditional Rezonings are exceptions to these rules. Exceptions must not be made haphazardly-the Commission must back up its decisions with solid, planning-backed reasoning. Consistency in the planning and design review process will create and maintain trust between the City and the general public. This trust and stability will create an environment in which citizens feel comfortable making investment and development decisions that will benefit Richmond.

One challenge that I expect the Commission will face in the short term is the sheer volume of requests- as I detail in Response 4, development in the City is booming and as a result, the number of requests for re-zonings has spiked. In addition to the administrative responsibility of this level of requests, it is crucial that the Planning Commission establish the sense of consistency in its review process that I mentioned previously.

3. How do you see the role of the public in the planning and design review process, and how can better public participation be achieved?

Assembling a citizen-led Planning Commission to directly affect the planning process is a wonderful way to involve the public in the planning and design review process. By allowing Richmonders to serve in this capacity, the City is ensuring that citizen input is applied to each situation presented to the Commission.

Commission members must remember that all citizens deserve a voice in the planning and design review process. Developers are citizens, as are historians, preservationists, and advocates. Those who apply for re-zonings and those who provide comment on the applications deserve equal consideration. And Commissioners are citizens who have committed to interpret and uphold City policy and make decisions that further the intended vision of growth for the City.

With that in mind, more constructive public participation comes at the start of the planning process. Ideally, the public would have enough input and buy-in in the formation of the zoning ordinance and land use plans that the need to grant zoning exceptions is very low. The importance of the ongoing master planning process, during which our zoning ordinance will be re-visited, cannot be overstated.

4. What planning challenges or issues do you see facing the city of Richmond in the next decade?

Richmond continues its upswing, with the urban population growing for the first time in decades and investment in the city's urban core, in the form of private development, business relocations, and restaurants of a caliber which gain national attention, gaining traction. This growth is happening within the confines of an outdated master plan and zoning ordinance. The City Planning Department fields almost daily re-zoning and SUP requests- likely because the current zoning code cannot accommodate the types of development being proposed. The Richmond 300 comprehensive plan update is a welcome opportunity to revisit the vision for our city and the surrounding region- but it must be done well. We do not want to "plan ourselves into a corner" by not anticipating development trends which reflect the way that people will want to live, work and travel/commute over the next decade.


The disturbing trend of increased income disparity in our city and across the country continues to be a challenge. This is a complicated issue that will require the will and cooperation of those who make major decisions impacting housing location and affordability, the provision of public education, the availability of public transportation, and many other sectors. Commission members should recognize the role that zoning plays in addressing issues of inequality, and exercise its powers where appropriate. For example, permitting accessory dwellings that can support the availability of affordable housing, or establishing inclusionary zoning requirements for development projects, are ways that zoning decisions can make a difference.

5. The review of planning matters tends to be more "shades of gray" than strictly "black or white". This involves balancing objective standards (i.e. laws and regulations) with subjective design criteria such as determining what the appropriate massing, bulk, and/or compatibility, etc., with an area should be. How comfortable are you in making subjective decisions based on an objective set of criteria?

I anticipate the issues that are presented to the Commission to be varied- some will be "by the book" reviews, where the Commission simply applies existing policy; and some will be dynamic and involved, requiring a nuanced understanding of both land use and zoning law and the character of the area in question. Because I have a background in planning and I regularly work with municipalities on zoning issues in my professional life, I am comfortable with these types of reviews. A "shades of grey" planning review does not mean that the review is haphazard or uninformed- I plan to use my judgment as a professional planner, coupled with my understanding of the City's intention for land use in a certain area and resident input, when making these types of calls. If a Planning Commission acts with integrity and can provide intelligent, thoughtful reasons for the decisions it makes, then its reviews of these types of issues will be respected.

as of May 13, 2018




