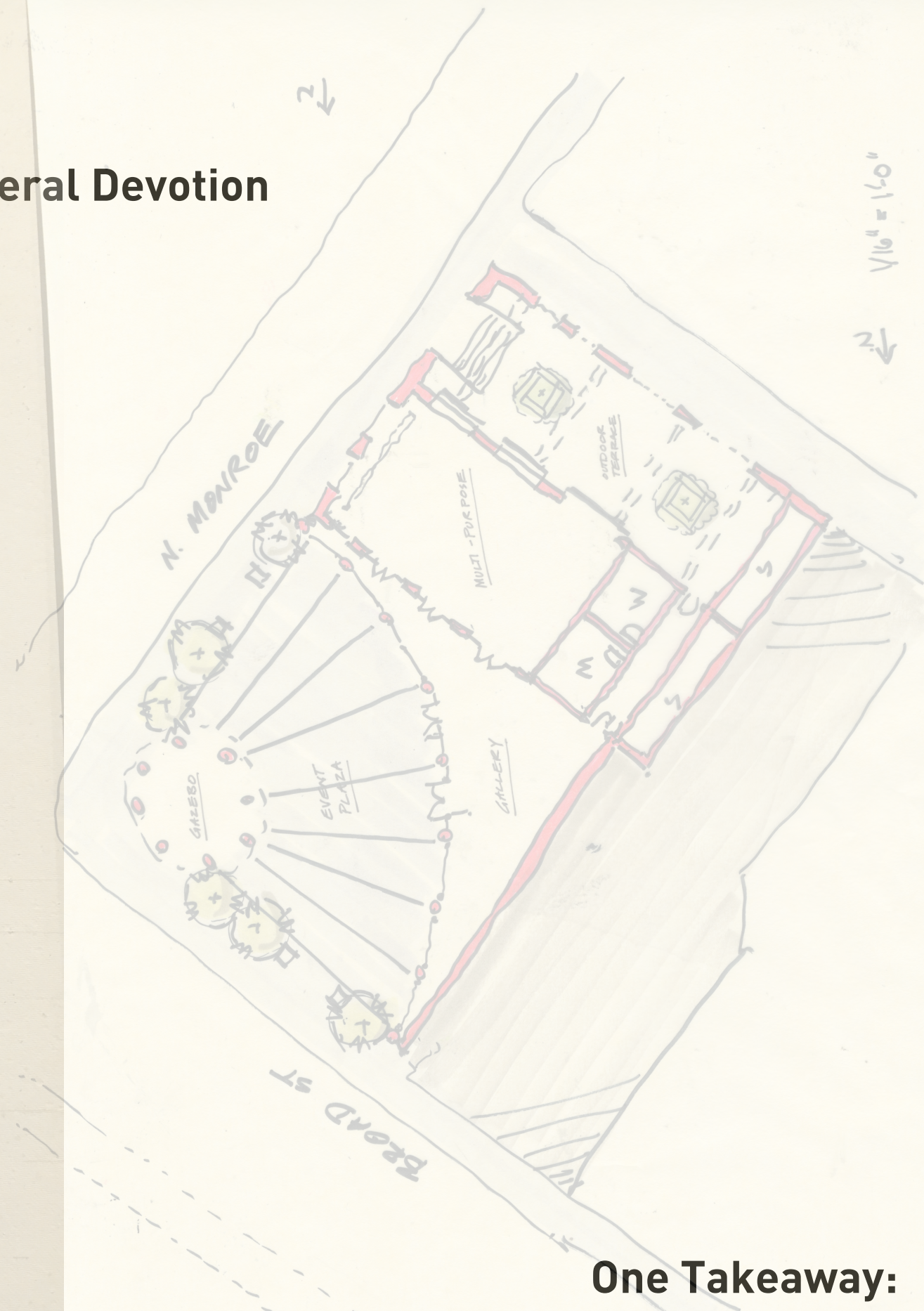

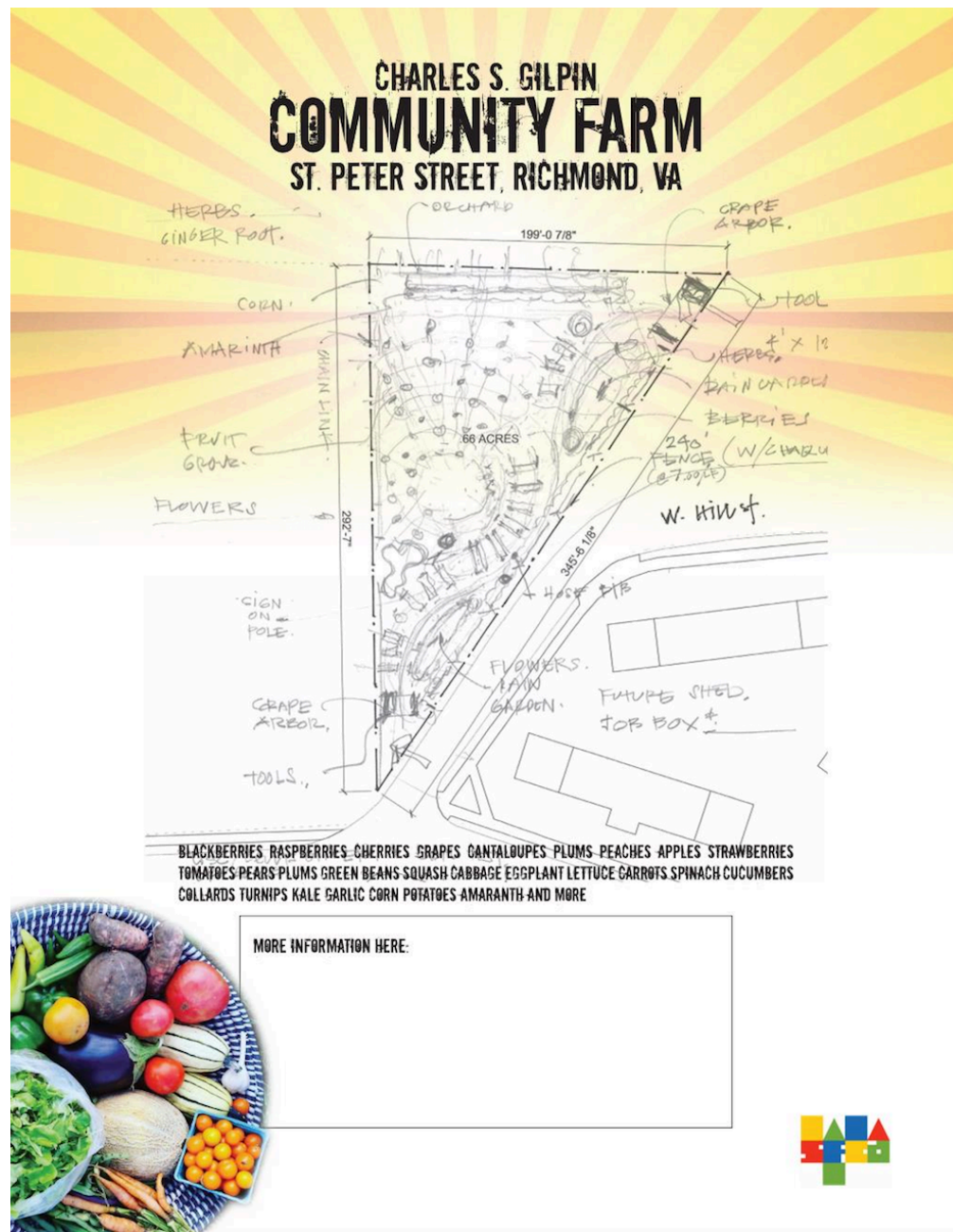

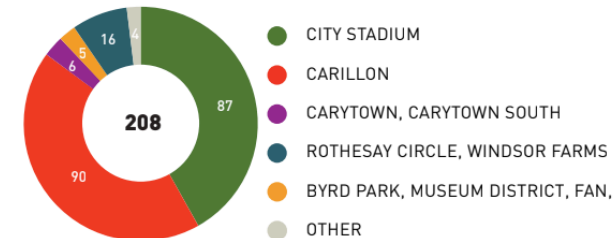
We are a resource for ALL city residents, nonprofits, small businesses and neighborhoods

Since our founding in 2011:

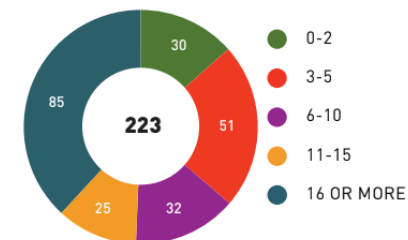
- More than 450 clients have received design assistance
- More than 200 professionals have donated their expertise (\$350K value)

- 11 volunteer days to repaint and repair commercial corridors
- More than 100 clients from RBHA have been through our 'Recovery by Design' process
- Multiple nonprofits and small businesses have been incubated



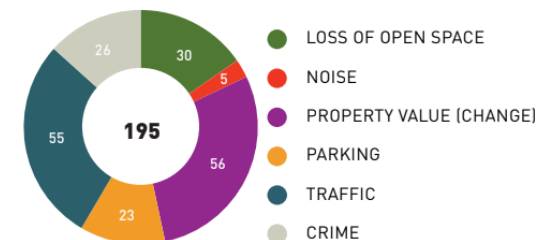

Empowering teens with the tools and experiences to shape the future they envision for their neighborhoods and the city as a whole through action, policy change, and improvements to the built environment.

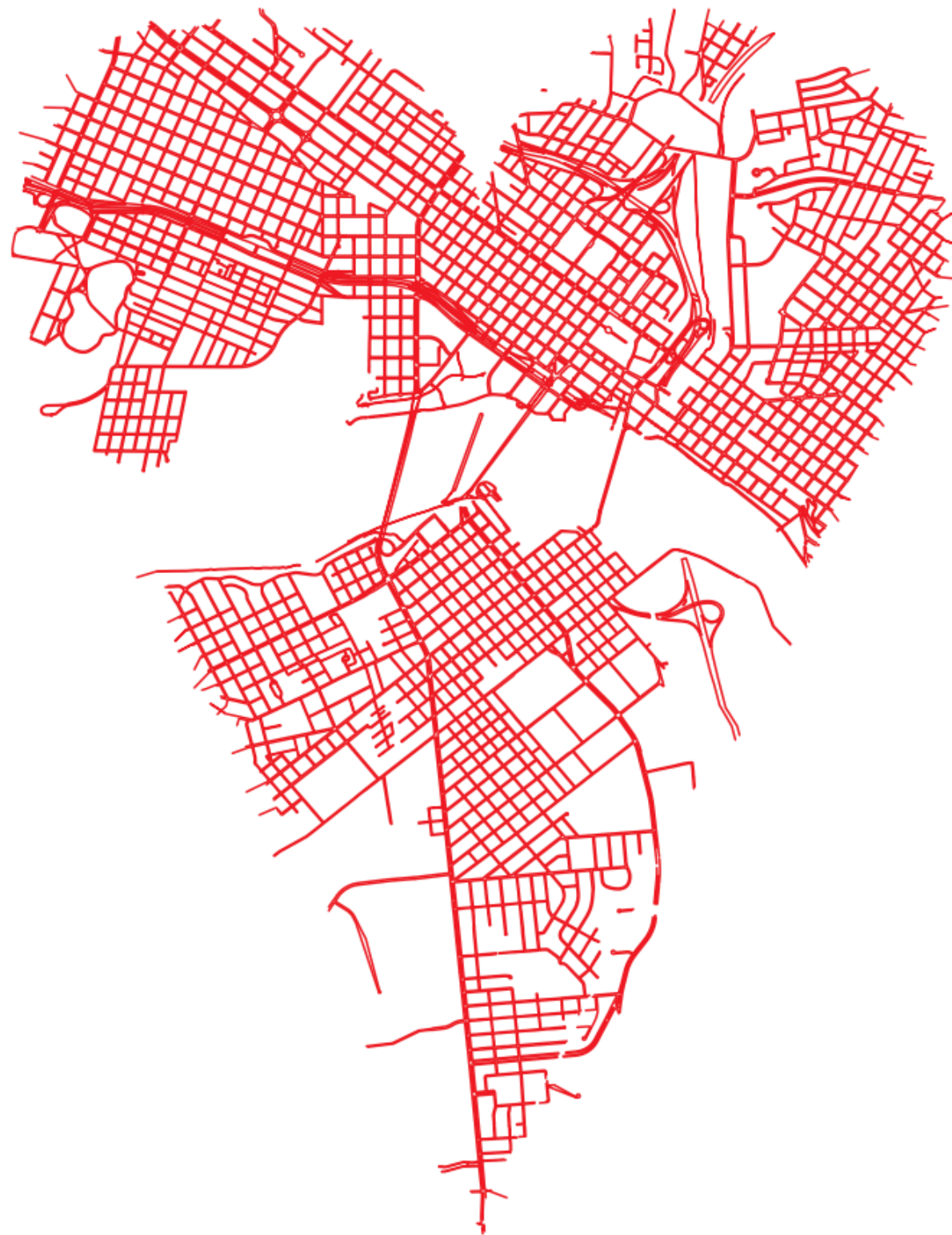

Recent national events provide an opportunity to re-examine the role of Confederate statuary in the public realm. **Monument Avenue: General Demotion General Devotion** is an international design ideas competition aiming to contribute to this important dialogue by inviting architects, planners, designers, artists and individuals to reimagine the entire 5.4 mile length of Monument Avenue in Richmond, Virginia, one of America's grandest boulevards. The Storefront for Community Design + the mOb studio at VCUarts will administer the competition funded by the National Endowment for the Arts. Monument Avenue provides a unique opportunity to enrich dialogue about race, memory, the urban landscape, and public art. Competition registration will run from April 1 to September 15, 2018 with submissions due on December 1, 2018. The Valentine will host a juried exhibition of entries opening on February 14, 2019.
