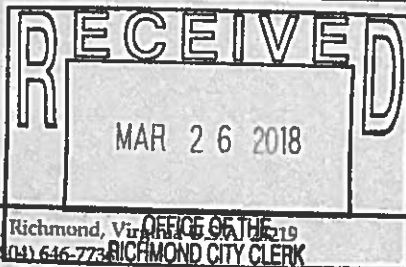

2. At-large resident of the city
3. Richmond Public Schools
4. Workforce development agency
5. Small minority business development organization
6. Technical educational institution
7. Higher educational institution
8. Law enforcement
9. State or local department of social services
10. Administrator of a community-based corrections program
11. Faith-based community organization
12. Business community
13. Council member representing the district in which the Justice Center is located

Non-voting Members:

Chief Administrative Officer or his designee.

The commission may elect from its membership a chairman and other officers it deems necessary in accordance with its rules of procedure or bylaws.
