## **Docket Review - Continued**

After consulting with legal counsel in closed session regarding Ords. 2018-101 and 2018-126, it was the consensus of Council to continue both pieces of proposed legislation to the May 14, 2018 Formal Session of Council with a comprehensive review at the May 7, 2018 Organizational Development Standing Committee meeting.

President Chris Hilbert requested that councilors forward questions regarding the Stone Brewing Phase II project to the Council Chief of Staff office for a response prior to the May Organizational Development Standing Committee meeting.

Entertaining further deliberation of docket items, Councilor Parker Agelasto questioned the tax sale of the properties referenced in proposed Ords. 2018-118, 2018-119, 2018-120, 2018-121, 2018-122, 2018-123, 2018-124 and 2018-125 to the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority instead of the intended recipient, Anna Julia Cooper Episcopal School.

Lee Downey, deputy chief administrative officer – Economic and Community Development, informed Council that the sale agreement for the proposed project will specify the intended community recreation center purpose of the properties.

Councilors Michael Jones and Ellen Robertson both inquired regarding the city's process for conveying properties acquired by way of a tax delinquent judicial sale.

After further discussion, it was the consensus of Council to continue Ords. 2018-118, 2018-119, 2018-120, 2018-121, 2018-122, 2018-123, 2018-124 and 2018-125 to the May 14, 2018 Formal Session of Council with further consideration at the May 7, 2018 Organizational Development Standing Committee meeting, in order to allow for the receipt of a letter of intent for the proposed tax sale and a discussion with Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority representatives regarding the project.
