### ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY

This Resolution is to establish a policy of Council that Council appoint from the three remaining appointees on the Retirement Board, a current city retiree.

#### BACKGROUND

The O&R is to request a resolution to establish a policy of the Council that the Council appoint from the three remaining appointees on the Richmond Retirement Board (RRS), not required to be from the classified service, be a current city retiree.

There are a total of seven trustees to the Richmond Retirement System (RRS) Board. The Charter directs that of the seven trustees, City Council appoints five members, two of whom must currently be members of the classified service, and the Mayor appoints two members. As written, the Charter allows Council or the Mayor to appoint a retiree to the Board as one of the members that can be appointed. Therefore, no amendment to the Charter or the City Code is necessary to appoint a retiree to the Board. However, a policy to establish this practice is being recommended by the patrons.

This Resolution proposes a policy that one of the five trustee appointments be designated for a retiree of the City of Richmond to offer a voice on policy from the perspective of an individual experiencing retirement. Given the operations and the Retirement Board's decisions, Council may consider as a part of the skill set of the retiree selection, financial and investment expertise.
