**RE:** Authorizing the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) to execute agreements with the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) for \$200,000 in Federal Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) funding and \$50,000 in Commonwealth Transportation Funds for the continuation of the City of Richmond Employee Trip Generating Reduction Program.

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**PURPOSE:** To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) to execute agreement with the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) for \$200,000 in Federal Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) funding and \$50,000 in Commonwealth Transportation Funds for the continuation of the City of Richmond Employee Trip Generating Reduction Program.

**REASON:** The City of Richmond Employee Trip Generating Reduction Program is funded from federal and state grant funds. The Commonwealth Transportation Funds are used as local match to Congestion Mitigation Transportation Funds (CMAQ) that are administered by the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) to fully fund the program.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Approval is recommended by the City Administration

**BACKGROUND:** The City of Richmond Employee Trip Reduction Program (RETRP) began in January 2004 to encourage City employees to use alternative forms of transportation in an effort to reduce the dependency on the automobile, reduce the demand for parking, and improve air quality. Since 2004, the City of Richmond has received Federal Highway Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) along with matching Commonwealth Transportation funds that are admin-

istered by the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) to fully fund the Richmond Employee Trip Generation Reduction Program. The grant funding is used to finance the purchase of GRTC swipe cards, as well as vanpool vouchers for full-time City of Richmond employees for their commute to and from work. Approximately 1022 City of Richmond Employees are enrolled in the program with approximately 350 active users. This program has provided 1.4M bus and vanpool trips resulting in a reduction of 18 tons of Hydrocarbons and 19 tons of Nitrous Oxide emissions over the thirteen year period.

### Project Agreement for Use of Commonwealth Transportation Funds Fiscal Year 2017

### Six Year Improvement Program Approved Project Federal Highway Administration Grant Number CM 5A27 (501) Grant Number 47017-04

This Project Agreement ("Agreement"), effective May 19, 2017, by and between the Commonwealth of Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation ("Department") and the City of Richmond ("Grantee") (collectively, the "Parties"), is for the provision of funding for the City of Richmond Employee Trip Reduction Program ("Project").

WHEREAS, on June 14, 2016, the Commonwealth Transportation Board ("CTB") allocated funding for the Project; and

WHEREAS, on May 19, 2017, the Federal Highway Administration ("FHWA") approved funding for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Department provides state matching funds to Federal funds for approved projects in the Six Year Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to define the extent of the Project, the responsibilities of each Party, the manner of performing the necessary Work, the method and time of payment, and to set out additional conditions associated with the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements set forth, and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

### ARTICLE 1. SCOPE OF WORK, TERM AND BUDGET

- 1. The Work to be performed by the Grantee under the terms of this Agreement is as follows:
  - a. Provide funding for the Project.
- 2. The Department agrees to provide funding as detailed below:
  - a. State grant funding in the amount of \$50,000 to match Federal funds for the Project approved in the Fiscal Year 2017 Six Year Improvement Program. Details concerning this funding are contained in Appendix 1, which is attached and made a part of this Agreement.
- 3. The Grantee acknowledges that state grant funding for this grant is subject to appropriation by the General Assembly of Virginia and allocation by the CTB.

# ARTICLE 2. INCORPORATION OF MASTER AGREEMENT FOR USE OF COMMONWEALTH FUNDS

The Parties agree to incorporate the Master Agreement for Use of Commonwealth Transportation Funds, dated December 13, 2012, as if set out in full herein.
