RE: Appropriation of Assigned Fund Balance for School Facility Maintenance – to be used for the abatement of lead in the water supply and other issues related to health and safety in Richmond Public Schools

PURPOSE: To amend the FY2018 Capital Improvement budget (Ord. 2017-038) by appropriating funds in the amount of \$1,000,000, earmarked in the assigned portion of the general fund balance, as of 6/30/2017, to the Richmond Public Schools - School Maintenance Capital Project to fund the abatement of lead in water fountains in public schools.

REASON: Council resolution #2017-R080 created a new reservation of assigned fund balance called the School Maintenance - Lead Abatement Reserve. Per this resolution, this reservation of funds is intended to be used for the abatement of lead in the water supply, first, and then other issues related to health and safety, in public schools administered by the School Board of the City of Richmond. This ordinance seeks to appropriate funds to Richmond Public Schools to assist in addressing the matter of lead found in water fountains in school facilities.

RECOMMENDATION: The city administration recommends adoption of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND: Recent media coverage has indicated that both Ginter Park and George Mason elementary schools' "water fountains were shut down after preliminary reports of water testing showed high, but still legal, levels of lead" according to the Richmond Times Dispatch. In addition, Channel 12 On Your Side also indicated "SB1359, if passed, will require schools to

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address any water contamination issues in potable water from sources identified by the EPA as high priority for testing, giving priority for such testing plan to schools whose school building was constructed, in whole or in part, before 1986".

In response to this recent media coverage, this amendment seeks to appropriate funds that were specifically set aside to address the abatement of lead in the water supply of school facilities, to RPS' school maintenance capital project. By doing so, RPS will have the funding to address this critical issue at their school facilities first, and any unspent funds, can be used to address other issues related to health and safety, per resolution 2017-080.

FISCAL IMPACT/COST: This ordinance will amend the RPS capital budget for school maintenance by increasing appropriations by \$1,000,000.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: The capital budget, specifically for the project titled Schools Capital Maintenance (500492), would change to reflect the additional revenue needed to support the projected expenditures associated with abating lead in water fountains at school facilities. Without access to these funds, RPS, may not have the resources needed to quickly address lead issues in schools nor address the probable passage of SB1359.
