There were no comments or discussions concerning Consent and Regular Agenda items reviewed.

Councilwoman Reva Trammell, chair of the Public Safety Standing Committee, agreed to the committee referral waiver of legislation approving the city's plan of services under the Virginia Juvenile Community Crime Control Act, which is to be introduced later that evening at the Formal Session of Council.

#### Bulk and Brush Audit

Bob Steidel, deputy chief administrative officer – Operations, informed Council that the bulk and brush study has been finalized and the findings report will be distributed by the close of business on Friday, June 1, 2018.

#### <u>City Council Expenditure and Reimbursement Guidelines Governing Uses of Council District</u> <u>Funds (Resolution 2015-R18-23)</u>

Councilwoman Reva Trammell expressed concern with the process for reimbursement of Council district funds when cumulative payments exceed \$1,000, which requires Council's approval via resolution.

Councilor Kim Gray also agreed that the adopted resolution was an elaborate process for reimbursements of Council district funds, especially since documentation is provided validating the purchase. Ms. Gray also acknowledged the need to process vendor payments in a timely fashion and stated that the current stipulation is a hindrance.

President Chris Hilbert suggested that Res. 2015-R18-23 be amended to exclude reimbursements to councilors from the categories of Council district expenditures applicable for approval via resolution.

Councilwoman Reva Trammell requested information regarding the utilization of contributions to the Richmond Public Schools Education Foundation, which will be reviewed by the Education and Human Services Standing Committee.

City Attorney Allen Jackson informed Council he would need additional time to vet changes to Res. 2015-R18-23 since staff with procurement expertise was currently out of the office.

Councilor Kim Gray suggested the suspension of Council's Rules of Procedure to allow for the immediate processing of payments until further deliberation.

President Chris Hilbert requested a report of pending vendor payments from Council district funds.
