§ 1. That section 8-441 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015) be and is hereby **amended** and reordained as follows:

Sec. 8-441. Designation of days and hours market areas open and closed.

The Chief Administrative Officer, or a designee thereof, shall adopt rules or regulations designating the days the market areas or any part of them shall be used by vendors selling or offering items for sale <u>or otherwise open to the public</u> and the time on such days when the market areas or any part of them shall be opened and closed [for such purpose].

§ 2. This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon adoption.

<u>PURPOSE</u>: To close the City-owned property known as the 17th Street Market and bordered by N. 17th Street, S. 17th Street, E. Main St., and Franklin St. to public use each day of the year from 1:30 a.m. until 5 a.m.

REASON: An ordinance is requested to establish the hours for closing the property to public use during such limited hours.

RECOMMENDATIONS: The Administration recommends adoption.

BACKGROUND:

The Shockoe Revitalization Strategy (2011, Office of Economic and Community Development), prioritized revitalization projects to be completed in conjunction with the Main Street Station Train Shed Rehabilitation Project and Multimodal Transportation Center. A priority of the Shockoe Revitalization Strategy was the transformation of the 17th Street Market to a pedestrian public plaza and the extension of outdoor dining lining the plaza.

Closing to public use during the designated times will allow for routine maintenance and repairs to facilitate a clean and safe Market. This closure to public use during the designated times will not

apply to the rights-of-way abutting the 17th Street Market (i.e., N. 17th Street, S. 17th Street, E. Main St., and E. Franklin St.).
