## EXPEDITED CONSIDERATION

1. To approve an expenditure in the amount of \$885.00 from the Council District Funds for the Second District to make a contribution to the Commonwealth of Virginia, Department of Historic Resources, towards the purchase of a replacement for Virginia Historical Marker SA-96 located at 216 West Leigh Street in the Second District.

## MOTION TO AMEND

2. To amend Ord. No. 2018-300, which closes, to public use and travel, a portion of the east side of North 30th Street and a portion of the south side of M Street abutting the property known as 623 North 30th Street, consisting of 535± square feet, upon certain terms and conditions.

## ORDINANCES

3. To amend Ord. No. 2018-057, adopted May 14, 2018, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 General Fund Budget, by increasing anticipated revenues from real estate taxes and the amount appropriated to the Non-Departmental agency, Tax Relief – Elderly/Disabled line item by \$400,000.00 for the purpose of providing additional funding to cover tax relief for the elderly and disabled pursuant to City Code §§ 26-364—26-365. **{No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
4. To amend Ord. No. 2018-057, adopted May 14, 2018, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 General Fund Budget and made appropriations pursuant thereto, by re-appropriating a \$250,000.00 portion of the calculated general fund surplus for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 to a new line item in the Non-Departmental agency called the “OPEB Trust” line item for the purpose of funding a contribution to the trust established by § 1 of Ord. No. 2018-196, adopted Jul. 23, 2018. **{No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
5. To amend Ord. No. 2018-057, adopted May 14, 2018, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 General Fund Budget, by increasing anticipated revenues from personal property taxes and the amount appropriated to the Procurement Operations program by \$125,000.00 for the purpose of providing additional funding for permanent full-time staff positions in the Department of Procurement Services. **{No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
6. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept funds in the amount of \$34,900.00 from the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles, and to appropriate the grant funds received to the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Police’s DMV

Traffic Enforcement & Safety Initiative special fund by \$34,900.00 for the purpose of supporting police traffic enforcement and safety initiatives to reduce the number of fatalities, injuries, and related economic losses resulting from traffic accidents. **{No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**

7. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept funds in the amount of \$17,500.00 from the Office of the Attorney General of Virginia, and to appropriate the grant funds received to the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Police's Project Safe Neighborhood (OAG) special fund by \$17,500.00 for the purpose of funding police training, travel expenses, overtime expenses, and investigative equipment to reduce gun and gang-related violent crime. **{No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
8. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept funds in the amount of \$12,500.00 from the Fund for Cities of Service, Inc., and to appropriate the grant funds received to the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to a new line item in the Office of the Deputy Chief Administrative Officer for Human Services called the "Love Your Block Grant" line item by \$12,500.00 for the purpose of addressing blight-related issues, including abandoned and vacant properties, graffiti, illegal dumping, and trash in public rights-of-way. **{No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
9. To adopt a new pay plan for the City and to repeal Ord. No. 93-117-159, adopted May 24, 1993, and all amendatory ordinances thereto. **{Organizational Development – January 7, 2019}**
10. To amend City Code § 2-1290, concerning the unclassified service, to conform the description of the unclassified service to the Pay Plan. **{Organizational Development – January 7, 2019}**
11. To amend and reordain City Code § 22-317, concerning additional retirement allowance for certain City officials, for the purpose of conforming titles to the Pay Plan. **{Organizational Development – January 7, 2019}**
12. To amend Ord. No. 95-198-182, adopted Jul. 24, 1995, as previously amended by Ord. No. 2000-208-199, adopted Jun. 26, 2000, and Ord. No. 2002-70-101, adopted Apr. 22, 2002, which authorized a Community Unit Plan (CUP) of the 62.9-acre property at the southwest corner of Chippenham Parkway and Forest Hill Avenue, to authorize drive-up, freestanding automated teller machines (ATM) as a principal use in the area designated as Parcel A, to authorize warehouses and self-storage facilities in the area designated as Parcel B as a principal permitted use, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – January 7, 2019}**
13. To conditionally rezone the properties known as 35, 41, 47, 53, 59, and 65 Rodman Road from the B-3 General Business District to the R-4 Single-Family Residential

District (Conditional), upon certain proffered conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – January 7, 2019}**

14. To amend and reordain Ord. No. 2007-131-174, adopted Jul. 23, 2007, which authorized the special use of the property known as 1400 Grove Avenue for the purpose of permitting a multifamily dwelling consisting of no more than ten units and authorized the special use of the properties known as 1410 and 1412 Grove Avenue for the purpose of allowing single-family attached dwellings on substandard sized lots, together with accessory off-street parking, to remove from the ordinance the provisions pertaining to 1412 Grove Avenue, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – January 7, 2019}**
15. To authorize the special use of the property known as 1412 Grove Avenue for the purpose of either a single-family attached dwelling or a single-family detached dwelling and up to four rooms or groups of rooms for short-term rental use, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – January 7, 2019}**
16. To amend Ord. No. 2014-121-201, adopted Nov. 10, 2014, as previously amended by Ord. No. 2016-171, adopted Sept. 12, 2016, which authorized the special use of the property known as 1650 Overbrook Road, for the purpose of authorizing multifamily dwellings with up to 205 dwelling units, to permit up to 117 multifamily dwelling units and other site amenities and an additional 55 dwelling units in place of commercial space, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – January 7, 2019}**
17. To authorize the special use of the property known as 202 West 15th Street for the purpose of a dwelling unit within an accessory building, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – January 7, 2019}**
18. To amend Ord. No. 2014-222-204, adopted Nov. 10, 2014, which authorized the special use of the property known as 2319 Grove Avenue for the purpose of authorizing an expansion to an existing day nursery, to authorize further expansion of the existing day nursery, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – January 7, 2019}**
19. To authorize the special use of the property known as 2413 Carrington Street for the purpose of a dwelling unit within an accessory building, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – January 7, 2019}**
20. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a Standard Project Administration Agreement between the City of Richmond and the Virginia Department of Transportation to provide funding for the upgrading of the City's traffic signal system by integrating it with regional automated vehicle location systems to control the timing of traffic signals for transit, emergency,

and other City-operated vehicles equipped with automated vehicle location systems for the purpose of maintaining transit schedules, improving emergency vehicle response, enhancing multimodal operations, and lowering vehicle emissions. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – January 22, 2019}**

21. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a Standard Project Administration Agreement between the City of Richmond and the Virginia Department of Transportation to provide funding for the installation of pedestrian access and safety improvements including crosswalks and traffic speed controls, and street enhancements including decorative paving, public art, landscaping, signage, and lighting on that portion of U.S. 360 known as Hull Street, between its intersection with West 9th Street and the southern terminus of the Mayo Bridge. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – January 22, 2019}**
22. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a Standard Project Administration Agreement between the City of Richmond and the Virginia Department of Transportation to provide funding for the installation of pedestrian access and safety improvements including crosswalks, refuge areas, continuous routes, and traffic channelization on the streets surrounding the park at Kanawha Plaza. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – January 22, 2019}**
23. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a Standard Project Administration Agreement between the City of Richmond and the Virginia Department of Transportation to provide funding for the design and construction of the fully accessible pedestrian infrastructure necessary to improve access to Greater Richmond Transit Company transit stops. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – January 22, 2019}**
24. To amend City Code § 24-63, concerning permit fees, and to amend the fees set forth in Appendix A of the City Code for City Code § 24-63, for the purpose of revising the fees for permits for certain activities in the public right-of-way. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – January 22, 2019}**
25. To designate the Cannon Creek Greenway bicycle and pedestrian trail located between its intersection with Henrico Drive and its intersection with Richmond Henrico Turnpike in honor of Dr. Charles Price. (Mrs. Robertson) **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – January 22, 2019}**
26. To authorize the City Attorney to file an appropriate petition pursuant to Va. Code § 23.1-815(B)(iv) for concurrent jurisdiction by the City's Department of Police and the campus police force of Virginia Commonwealth University in certain designated areas. **{Public Safety– January 22, 2019}**
27. To amend and reordain City Code §§ 2-161, concerning employee disclosure of misconduct and protection from retaliation, and 2-163, concerning determinations

regarding complaints, for the purpose of replacing references to “City Auditor” with “Inspector General.” (President Hilbert) **{Governmental Operations – January 24, 2018}**
