PURPOSE: To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) to accept \$34,900 from the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and appropriate the same to the FY2019 Special Fund Budget for the purpose of supporting Traffic Enforcement and Safety Initiatives.

REASON: The Adopted 2019 Special Fund Budget for DMV Traffic Enforcement & Safety Initiatives is \$100,000. Subsequently the City of Richmond Police Department was awarded four grants from DMV totaling \$134,900, which is \$34,900 greater than the amount appropriated by the FY 2019 Adopted Special Fund Budget.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that this funding is accepted and appropriated to the Richmond Police Department FY 2019 Special Fund Budget for DMV Traffic Enforcement & Safety Initiatives.

BACKGROUND: The National Highway Safety Act of 1966 provides federal grants to states to support coordinated national highway safety programs. The Virginia Highway Safety Office (VAHSO) is responsible for administering these federal highway safety funds and serves as a valuable resource to the Virginia Legislature

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on highway safety issues. The VAHSO also serves in a coordinating role in various highway safety-related initiatives.

The VAHSO provides grants for programs which are designed to reduce the number of fatalities, injuries and related economic losses resulting from traffic crashes on Virginia's roadways. Local governments, law enforcement agencies, state agencies, academic institutions, and private non-profits can apply for National Highway Traffic Safety Administration pass-through funding for projects related to various areas of highway safety. Funding areas include the following:

- <u>Alcohol and Impaired Driving</u>
- Occupant Protection Safety Belt and Child Passenger Safety
- Aggressive Driving and Speeding
- <u>Traffic Records</u>
- Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety
- <u>Motorcycle Safety</u>
- <u>Roadway Safety</u>

The Richmond Police Department receives funding for four areas: Alcohol, Pedestrian, Occupant and Speed.

FISCAL IMPACT / COST: These funds will increase the FY19 Special Funds Budget.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: The addition of these funds (\$34,900) will allow the Richmond Police Department an opportunity to financially support the DMV Traffic Enforcement Safety Initiatives for the City of Richmond.

BUDGET AMENDMENT NECESSARY: Yes. This request amends the FY19 Special Fund Budget.

REVENUE TO CITY: The City of Richmond will add \$34,900 to the FY19 Special Funds Budget.

Ordinance No. 2018-058 Special Fund Budgets Text Amendments

- The Director of Finance shall credit all revenue from delinquent real estate taxes collected or received in excess of the \$10,340,235 in such revenue as presented in the budget submitted by the Mayor to the "Delinquent Tax Sales" special fund of the Office of the City Attorney for the purpose of offsetting any deficit in that special fund. This text amendment applies only for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019, and accordingly shall expire on June 30, 2019.
- 2. Within the "Street Maintenance" special fund of the Department of Public Works, funds in the amount of \$129,976 during the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019, and \$162,947 during the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, shall be spent only to abate graffiti in the city.
