PURPOSE: To amend the FY2019-FY23 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) by transferring \$4,469,000 from the School CIP Planning and Construction project and appropriating that same amount, \$4,469,000, into the School Capital Maintenance project to address urgent capital maintenance needs identified by Richmond Public Schools.

REASON: The School Board of RPS has requested that a transfer occur between the following project accounts to address capital maintenance needs. A letter was sent to the Mayor requesting the transfer and is attached.

RECOMMENDATION: The Administration recommends adoption of this ordinance

BACKGROUND: Richmond Public Schools identified \$10,150,000 in urgent capital maintenance needs. The Richmond Public Schools Capital Maintenance account has approximately \$5.6 million available as of June 30, 2018. Transferring the funds from the School Planning and Construction project will enable RPS to address the critical needs that they have identified.

The School Board supports a recommendation from the superintendent to request from City Council the reappropriation of the following funds:

- Reallocation of \$4,469,000 million from the School CIP Planning and Construction fund
