

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Demolish two brick piers.

PROJECT DETAILS

- The applicant proposes to demolish two freestanding brick piers in the rear of the home.
- The existing home is a two-story brick Late Victorian dwelling, built ca. 1895, located at the corner of East Clay Street and North 21st Street.



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STAFF RECOMMENDATION

APPROVE

PREVIOUS REVIEWS

The Commission approved the construction of a brick wall at the rear of the property on November 26, 2018. At the time the applicant wished to retain the piers but the Commission was amenable to their removal.

STAFF RECOMMENDED CONDITIONS

None.

STAFF ANALYSIS

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The Commission shall approve requests for demolition when: a building or structure is deemed not to be a contributing part of the historic character of the Old and Historic District.

The brick piers do not appear to be present in a photograph of the property from the 1950s. As the demolition of the piers would not negatively impact the Union Hill City Old and Historic District, staff recommends approval.

It is the assessment of staff that the application is consistent with the Standards for Rehabilitation and New Construction outlined in Section 30-930.7 (b) and (c) of the City Code, as well as with the Richmond Old and Historic Districts Handbook and Design Review Guidelines, specifically the pages cited above, adopted by the Commission for review of Certificates of Appropriateness under the same section of the code.








Figure 3. Brick piers in rear yard.




Figure 2. Rear of 2100 East Clay Street, 1950s.
