Vice Chair Kristen Larson moved to amend the agenda as follows:

ORD. 2018-236

To amend ch. 26, art. V, div. 2 of the City Code by adding therein new sections 26-370-26-374, concerning a real estate tax deferral program for real estate owned and occupied as a sole dwelling, for the purpose of establishing a new real estate tax deferral program for real estate owned and occupied as a sole dwelling.

ORD. 2018-254

To amend Ord. No. 2018-057, adopted May 14, 2018, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 General Fund Budget and made appropriations pursuant thereto, by transferring funds in the amount of \$30,000.00 from the Office of Community Wealth Building's Workforce Development program and re-appropriating these transferred funds to a new line item in the Non-Departmental agency called the "Owens & Minor Medical, Inc. On the Job Training Grant through the EDA" line item for the purpose of making a grant to Owens & Minor Medical, Inc., to subsidize certain job training activities by Owens & Minor Medical, Inc.

The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

The following resolution was considered:

RES. 2019-R009

To establish a policy that the City Council intends to appropriate the greater of 55.4 percent of estimated receipts from real estate taxes or the percentage of estimated receipts from real estate taxes reflected in the adopted Fiscal Year 2019-2020 General Fund Budget annually for school operating expenses subject to certain conditions.

Vice Chair Kristen Larson introduced RES. 2019-R009 and explained that the proposed legislation will help identify a predictable and stable source of dedicated revenue for Richmond Public Schools (RPS).

Bill Echelberger, council budget analyst, was available to respond to questions.

Lenora Reid, deputy chief administrative officer – Finance and Administration, stated that city administration supports funding for RPS, but does not necessarily support earmarking revenue.

John Wack, director of Finance, echoed remarks regarding the city's appropriations for schools.

Member Parker Agelasto expressed support of RES. 2019-R009.

Chair Michael Jones stated that he supports dedicated funding for RPS; however, he was concerned that earmarking a percentage of real estate tax revenue could impact city operations in the event revenue decreases.

Vice Chair Larson asked Council staff to attach supplementary documentation regarding school formula comparatives, to the proposed resolution.

Chair Jones and Member Agelasto asked to be added as co-patrons of RES. 2019-R009.

There were no further comments or discussions and **Member Agelasto moved to forward** RES. 2019-R009 to Council with the recommendation to approve, which was seconded and unanimously approved.

The following resolution was considered:

RES. 2019-R012

To set the rate of personal property tax relief for qualifying vehicles for the 2019 tax year pursuant to City Code §§ 26-495-26-497.

There were no further comments or discussions and **Member Agelasto moved to forward** RES. 2019-R012 to Council with the recommendation to approve, which was seconded and unanimously approved.
