President Cynthia Newbille called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., and presided.

Invocation was offered by Jeanne Pupke of First Unitarian Universalist Church of Richmond, 1000 Blanton Avenue, Richmond, VA.

Members of Council and the audience recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

CHAMBER EMERGENCY EVACUATION PLAN AND CITIZEN SPEAKER GUIDELINES

Upon the President's request, Interim Deputy City Clerk Lisa Braxton provided information on the appropriate manner in which the Council Chamber is to be evacuated in the event of an emergency along with citizen speaker guidelines.

APPOINTMENTS AND REAPPOINTMENTS

There were no appointment/reappointment items for consideration.

AWARDS AND PRESENTATIONS

Councilwoman Reva Trammell, on behalf of Richmond City Council, recognized Annie Reese, School Crossing Guard for the Richmond Police Department Office of Support Services, for nearly 50 years of dedicated public service.

Kristen Thompson, a Blackwell resident, presented Ms. Reese with a token of appreciation on behalf of the Blackwell community.

Councilor Ellen Robertson, on behalf of Richmond City Council, recognized the late Dorothy Irene Height, a Richmond native and nationally recognized civil rights activist, for her leadership and service. The Richmond Alumni Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority's members and its President Connie Cuffee were present to receive the award. Councilor Kim Gray, on behalf of Richmond City Council, recognized Joseph "Joe" Taylor, Virginia Union University Athletic Director, for his election as a member of the College Football Hall of Fame Class of 2019.

CITIZEN COMMENT

Jeremy Weiland expressed concern regarding the construction of new single-family homes in the Springhill Old and Historic District which he said was not being constructed to the approved specifications the Commission of Architectural Review and did not meet the guidelines of the Old and Historic District. Mr. Weiland indicated that the city failed to address concerns of the residents.

Vice President Chris Hilbert asked for a response from city administration regarding the matter.

William Bennett expressed similar concerns regarding the single-family homes being constructed in the Springhill Old and Historic District. Mr. Bennett stated that the developer has failed to adhere to specifications approved by the city and continues with the construction of the structures despite numerous violations and expired permits.

Councilor Parker Agelasto advised Council of his plans to meet with City Planner Kimberly Chen regarding concerns expressed by area residents.

Councilor Kim Gray requested an update on the matter at a future meeting of Council.

Chris Dorsey addressed Council regarding constitutional rights.

Michael Barber, member of the Carytown Merchants Association (CMA), asked Council to support funding for the CMA to continue beautification efforts in Carytown.

Amanda Slone, social media chair for Carytown, urged Council to support funding for the beautification of Carytown.

Ansley Perkins addressed Council regarding the importance of the Education Compact meetings and a need for city leaders to be more actively involved in the meetings.

Jerome Legions, co-chair of RVA Coalition for Concerned Civic Associations, addressed Council regarding proposed tax increases included in the mayor's budget proposal.
