§ 1. That, as authorized by section 15.2-953(B) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the City hereby makes the following grants to the following organizations:

PURPOSE: To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer for and on behalf of the City of Richmond to execute certain grant agreements between the City of Richmond and various non-profit organizations for the purpose of addressing blight-related issues, including abandoned and vacant properties, graffiti, illegal dumping, and trash in public rights-of-way.

REASON: For Neighbor-To-Neighbor (Office on Volunteerism) to provide funding to approved community-based groups to address blight-related issues including, but not limited to, graffiti removal, illegal dumping and trash in public rights-of-way, repairing dilapidated benches and fences, painting, and beautifying both public and private lots with community gardens.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that this paper be assigned to the Education and Human Services Standing Committee for review and, upon approval, be approved for disbursement from the Fiscal Year 2019 Special Fund Budget for the Office of the Deputy Chief Administrative Officer for Human Services.

BACKGROUND: The mission of Neighbor-To-Neighbor (N2N), the City of Richmond's Office on Volunteerism, is to help leverage volunteerism as a city strategy to help meet needs, solve problems, cultivate relationships, and build One Richmond. N2N works collaboratively with city departments, non-city agencies, and individuals, connecting them to service opportunities that align with city goals to create safe, beautiful, and better quality neighborhoods. This grant is vital to ensuring that the City is able to maintain the City's goal to create safe, beautiful, and better quality neighborhoods. As part of this mission, the Mayor introduced Ordinance No. 2018-318, adopted January 14, 2019, which authorized the Chief Administrative Officer to accept \$12,500 in grant funds from the Fund for Cities of Service, Inc., and appropriated those funds to the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Special Fund Budget for the purpose of addressing blight-related issues, including abandoned and vacant properties, graffiti, illegal dumping, and trash in public-rights-of-way. This current legislative request takes the next step by facilitating the execution of the grant contracts necessary to carry out the purposes and goals of Ordinance No. 2018-318, as described and for the amounts set forth in the attached document entitled "City of Richmond, Office on Volunteerism - Neighbor-To-Neighbor (N2N), Love Your Block (LYB) Mini-Grant Program."

FISCAL IMPACT / COST: The City received \$12,500.00 in grant funds from Fund for Cities of Service, Inc. to provide funding to address blight-related issues including abandoned and vacant properties, graffiti, illegal dumping, and trash in public rights-of-way. These grant funds were appropriated pursuant to Ordinance No. 2018-318, adopted January 14, 2019.
