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I purchased this property in June of 2017 it is important to understand this is not a historic building, it has aluminum siding, replacement windows and a chain link fence that was in terrible condition on the side and back yard.

I hired Hurricane Fence Company to replace the fence, I relied on their reputation and assertion that they we experienced in Church Hill. Their Documents clearly say no permit required. They installed a picket fence on the roadside, and privacy fence in the back corners of the yard. The fence was installed on 5/3 and I was issued a violation for not having a COA on 5/7. I was not aware a COA was necessary for a fence replacement.

It is my understanding that fences are generally approved at the administrative level, unfortunately I am now being told since the material the fence is made of is vinyl and for that reason it cannot be approved administratively only the commission can make an exception and approve it. I respectfully request the commission to provide an exception for the use of vinyl and the necessary CAR approval and remove this violation. Please note; there are many examples of vinyl being used as a building material in historic district including vinyl windows, porch railing, and fences, I have included pictures of several examples.

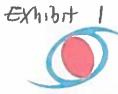
I am sorry I did not request this before the work was complete, I did not understand it was required for a fence, and I relied on a fence contractor who claimed to know the area well and they offered me only vinyl. The fence they installed is more expensive than wood I certainly would not have selected it if I knew it would cause a violation. I would point out that in the old city historic guidelines fences are not called out in the table of contents or the architectural review chart. There is only one page in this 155-page document that discusses fences and that page clearly prohibits chain link fences which was there when I bought the house, looked terrible and has now been removed.

I made a mistake relying on a local contractor for guidance, I don't feel the commissions documentation is clear enough for new residents that the approval requirement extends beyond the house to items like a fence. If I had understood this, I certainly would have requested the COA prior to buying a \$4200 fence.

The result of this error is the removal of a prohibited fence that was in disrepair and an eye sore replacing it with a new picket and privacy fence both styles of fence are consistent with the guidelines, that look great and clearly enhance the street they are on. Unfortunately, they are made from the of vinyl, which is why I need an exception and for the commission to approve this fence. The cost to replace this fence with wood is \$3,942.00 after spending \$4200 on the vinyl fence, I am not in a position where I can afford to replace it. Like you I want to see Church Hill rehabilitated, this is why I replaced the chain link fence I hope you agree it improves the neighborhood and allow me to keep it.

Bill,

Here are the new proposals for both options that you have asked for:

- 1. \$3,942 for the 6' face and cap. That includes all 6x6 post with the mahogany NE post caps. We will use 1x6x6 pickets with the 1x4 face board and bottom board. The 4' section will be a special cut French gothic picket, they will all be 1x4x4's. That will have flat post that will be 4x4x6's.
- 2. \$1,922 for just the 4' special cut French gothic, pickets will be 1x4x4's and the post will be 4x4x6's.

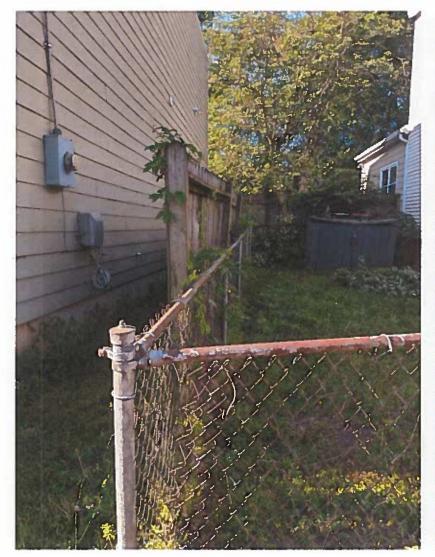

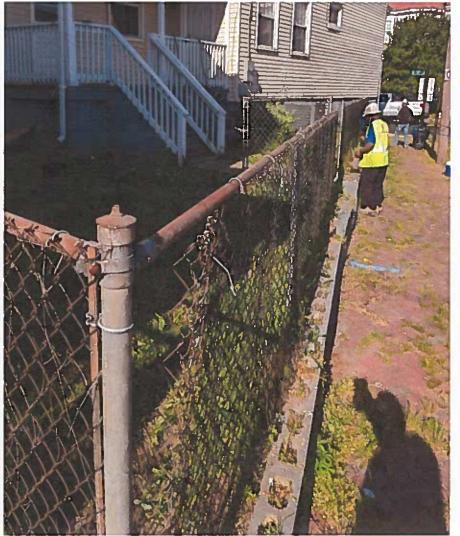

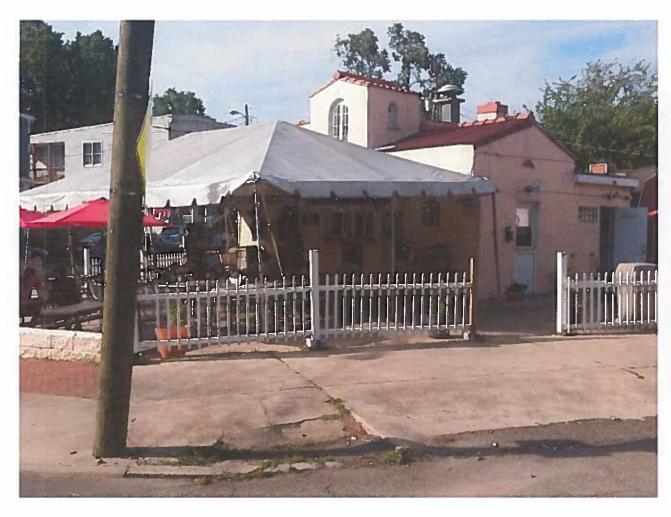


Front and Side views of my house With the new fence

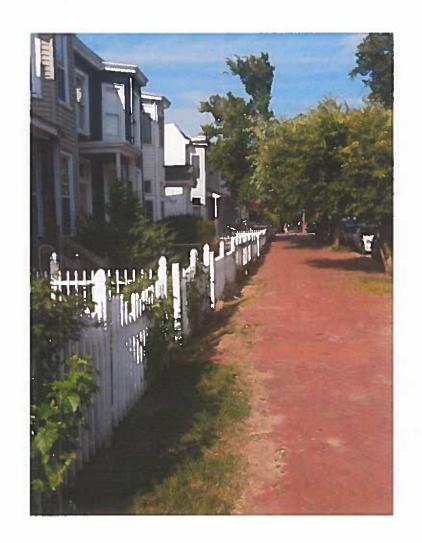
