### PROJECT DESCRIPTION


## Demolish an existing retaining wall and re-grade the site.

#### **PROJECT DETAILS**

This application is the result of a code enforcement action.

- The applicant requests permission to demolish an existing retaining wall.
- The applicant proposes to also remove the trees behind the wall and pull back the grade.
- The applicant will remove the excess soils and stabilize the area with seed and jute mesh.
- If needed, a temporary silt fence will be added at the sidewalk. The silt fence will be removed when the seeds are established to further prevent erosion.

On February 8th, 2017 a previous owner received a demolition permit for the house and retaining wall. The Commissioner of Buildings deemed it hazardous and review by the Commission of Architectural Review was not required. The house and retaining wall were not demolished before the permit expired on August 7, 2017. In October 2017 the current owners acquired the property.

# **STAFF ANALYSIS**

Demolition, pg. 82, #2	The retaining wall is a contemporary addition to he Union Hill City Old and Historic District. Staff s unable to locate a date of construction for this retaining wall, though staff believes it could be ca. 1976 when Mosby Street was widened with the construction of the Martin Luther King Jr. Bridge. Staff finds that this mid- to late-20 <sup>th</sup> century structure does not enhance the historic character of the City Old and Historic District.
of	of the City Old and Historic District.

Staff believes the demolition of the retaining wall would not negatively impact the Union Hill City Old and Historic District, and <u>staff recommends</u> approval of the demolition request.

It is the assessment of staff that the application is consistent with the Standards for Rehabilitation and New Construction outlined in Section 30-930.7 (b) and (c) of the City Code, as well as with the Richmond Old and Historic Districts Handbook and Design Review Guidelines, specifically the pages cited above, adopted by the Commission for review of Certificates of Appropriateness under the same section of the code.




Figure 1. 815 Mosby Street, wall.
