The Maggie L Walker Initiative Citizens Advisory Board shall be composed of sixteen members, including seven members appointed by the mayor, eight members appointed by the Council and a Human Services Manager.

The mayor shall appoint members from each of the following categories:

- (a) Four persons who, at the time of appointment, reside in a census tract within the city of Richmond with a poverty rate of at least 25%. At least one of the four persons shall, at the time of appointment, be a tenant of the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority or a recipient of Section 8 housing vouchers from the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority;
- (b) A representative of a service provider assisting low-income individuals or families;
- (c) A representative of a community organization or advocacy group with a primary focus on the reduction of poverty and who resides within the city of Richmond;
- (d) A person who resides within the city of Richmond.

The Council shall appoint members from each of the following categories:

- (e) Four persons who, at the time of appointment, reside in a census tract within the city of Richmond with a poverty rate of at least 25%. At least one of the four persons shall, at the time of appointment, be a tenant of the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority or a recipient of Section 8 housing vouchers from the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority;
- A business owner or a representative of a business with a workforce made up of employees, the majority of whom reside in the city of Richmond;
- (g) A representative of a college or university located within the city of Richmond with expertise in studying poverty or in program evaluation;
- (h) A person who resides within the city of Richmond;
- (i) A member of the City Council, who shall be a non-voting member of the board and shall serve as co-chair.

Over the last 9 years, I've built programs and cross-sector partnerships with RRHA, RCHD, VCU, Bon Secours and others. In most cases, these partnerships have focused on building capacity and opportunity within historically marginalized communities. Prior to joining Shalom Farms I worked for Palmetto Project - a statewide agency that identifies innovative strategies to address the social and economic challenges facing low-income South Carolinians. I managed our statewide "youth, families, and schools" programs. My interest in community wealth building began in my first job out of college with Ashoka's Youth Venture. At Youth Venture I worked to inspire and support 12-20 year olds to create social ventures and become social entrepreneurs.





A Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the City and the Maggie Walker Community Land Trust (MWCLT) authorized by Ordinance No. 2017–196, adopted February 26, 2018, requires the establishment of a Citizen's Advisory Panel, consisting of nine (9) members as set forth below:

- one (1) member designated by the Chief Administrative Officer of the City of Richmond, who shall serve as Chair
- two (2) members appointed by the Richmond City Council
- two (2) members appointed by the Mayor of the City of Richmond
- four (4) members appointed by the MWCLT Board

The Citizens' Advisory Panel shall advise and make recommendations to the MWCLT Board with respect to the development of any property received by the MWCLT from the City pursuant to the MOA. The disposition or transfer of any property received by the MWCLT from the City pursuant the MOA shall be subject to the approval of the Citizens' Advisory Panel. MWCLT may dispose of or transfer a property received by MWCLT from the City pursuant to the MOA without the approval of the Citizens' Advisory Panel only upon a two-thirds vote of the MWCLT Board.

Term of members: As provided by the provisions from sections 2-755 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015), unless otherwise specified by general law, ordinance or resolution, the term of office for the members of any board or commission the members of which are appointed by the Council shall be three years from the date of appointment.
