THE CITY OF RICHMOND HEREBY ORDAINS:

§ 1. That Chapter 24, Article I of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015) be and is hereby amended and reordained by **adding therein a new** section numbered 24-4 as follows:

Sec. 24-4. Report required on the condition of all streets in the city.

The Department of Public Works shall [eonduct a study] produce a report of the condition of all streets in the city and provide [a] such report to City Council by no later than February 1, [2019] 2020, and by no later than February 1 each year thereafter. The report on the condition of all streets in the city shall include the following:

(1) An assessment of the condition of the City's streets in comparison with state and

national standards. The Department of Public Works may use the latest assessment to provide

this data based on an assessment being conducted every three years.

(2) An assessment of the adequacy of the City's streets to handle the current and

projected volume of traffic in comparison with state and national standards.

(3) A prioritized list of paving needs and repairs and the projected costs thereof

arranged by Council District.

(4) An estimate of the cost of remediation for any identified deficiencies.

(5) A plan of action for addressing such deficiencies including estimates of funding

required from City, state, federal, and other sources, and recommendations for policy changes as

appropriate.

§ 2. This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon adoption.

ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY

The Patron requests an ordinance to require the Department of Public Works to:

- Undertake a comprehensive study of the condition of all streets, roads, and bridges in the City of Richmond, and
- Provide a report on the condition of all streets, roads, and bridges in the City of Richmond to City Council no later than February 1, 2019, and February 1 each year thereafter.
- The required report shall include:
 - o An assessment of the condition of the City's streets, roads, and bridges in comparison to state and national standards,
 - An assessment of the adequacy of the City's streets, roads, and bridges to handle the current and projected volume of traffic in comparison to state and national standards.
 - o A prioritized list of paving needs and repairs, and the projected costs thereof arranged by Council District,
 - o An estimate of the cost of remediation for any identified deficiencies,
 - o A plan of action for addressing such deficiencies, including estimates of funding required from city, state, federal, and other sources, and recommendations for policy changes as appropriate.

BACKGROUND

Summary:

- The City of Richmond maintains approximately 1,860 lane miles of roads and 836 lane miles of sidewalks. In addition, Roadway Maintenance also maintains Richmond's 3,000 alleys, which equate to 200 miles.
- The City's Department of Public Works currently assesses the condition of the City's streets, roads, and bridges. (A copy of the pavement condition map from August 2017 is attached.)
- Richmond City Council does not currently receive a comprehensive report on the condition of all of the City's streets, roads, and bridges.
- The patron believes that an annual report on the condition of the City's streets, roads, and bridges to City Council will enhance the governing body's ability to set policy and budget priorities.
