

#### **Submittal Deadlines**

All applications and support materials must be filed no later than 21 days prior to the scheduled meeting of the Urban Design Committee (UDC). Please see the schedule on page 3 as actual deadlines are adjusted due to City holidays. Late or incomplete submissions will be deferred to the next meeting.

#### Filing

Applications can be mailed or delivered to the attention of "Urban Design Committee" at the address listed at the top of this page. It is important that the applicant discuss the proposal with appropriate City agencies, Zoning Administration staff, and area civic associations and residents prior to filing the application with the UDC.

#### **Submittal Deadlines**

The UDC is a ten member committee created by City Council in 1968 whose purpose is to advise the City Planning Commission (CPC) on the design of projects on City property or right-of-way. The UDC provides advice of an aesthetic nature in connection with the performance of the duties of the Commission under Sections 17.05, 17.06, and 17.07 of the City Charter. The UDC also advises the Department of Public Works in regards to private encroachments in the public right-of-way.



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#### **Submssion Requirements**

- •An electronic copy (PDF preferred) of all application materials, which can be emailed, or delivered by FTP or USB.
- •Three (3) copies of the application cover sheet and all support materials (see below).
- •Plan sheets should be 11" x 17", folded to 8 1/2" x 11". If it is not possible to scale plans to these dimensions, please provide one set of larger, scaled plans.
- •All applications must include the attached cover sheet and the following support materials, as applicable to the project, based on Review Type:

#### Conceptual Review:

- •A detailed project narrative which includes the following: purpose of the project, project background, project budget and funding sources, description of construction program and estimated construction start date (description should also provide information on the surrounding area to provide context).
- •A site plan for the project indicating site characteristics which include: building footprints, parking areas, pedestrian routes, recreation areas, open areas, and areas of future expansion.
- •A set of floor plans and elevations, as detailed as possible.
- •A landscaping plan which shows the general location and character of plant materials and notes any existing tree to be removed.

#### Final Review:

- •A detailed project narrative which includes the following: purpose of the project, project background, project budget and funding sources, description of construction program, and estimated construction start date (description should also provide information on the surrounding area to provide context).
- •A site plan for the project indicating site characteristics which include: building footprints, parking areas, pedestrian routes, recreation areas, open areas, and areas of future expansion.
- •A set of floor plans and elevations, as detailed as possible.
- •A landscaping plan that includes a complete plant schedule, the precise location of all plant materials, and a landscape maintenance analysis. The plant schedule must show number, size and type of each planting proposed. If existing trees are to be removed, their size, type, and location must be noted on the landscape plan.
- •The location of all lighting units should be noted on a site plan, including wall-mounted, site, and parking lot lighting. Other site details such as benches, trash containers, and special paving materials should also be located. Include specification sheets for each item.
- •Samples of all proposed exterior building materials, including but not limited to brick, mortar, shingles, siding, glass, paint, and stain colors. When an actual sample cannot be provided, a product information sheet that shows the item or a photo of an existing item may be substituted.

#### **Review and Processing**

- •Once an application is received, it is reviewed by Staff, who compiles a report that is sent to the UDC.
- A copy of the report and the meeting agenda will be sent to the applicant prior to the meeting.
- •At the UDC meeting, the applicant or a representative should be present or the application may be deferred to the next regularly scheduled meeting. It is also strongly suggested that a representative of the City Agency which will have final responsibility for the item be present at the meeting (if the applicant and the representative are not the same).
- •Once the UDC recommends action on the application, it is automatically placed on the agenda for the next City Planning Commission (CPC) meeting. Exceptions to this are encroachment applications, recommendations for which are forwarded to the Department of Public Works.
- •At the CPC meeting, the applicant or a representative should be present, or the application may be deferred to the next regularly scheduled meeting.

#### NORTH DRIVE SECURE ENTRANCE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES

#### **DETAILED PROJECT NARRATIVE:**

#### **Purpose of the Project:**

To modify both vehicular approach and screening capabilities for vehicles seeking entry to the Capitol Campus.

To harden the security of Commonwealth Gate #1 thereby addressing security concerns and vulnerabilities that currently exist to pedestrians and Commonwealth of Virginia facilities (i.e. the State Capitol and the Governor's Mansion).

#### **Project Background:**

Historically, Gate #1 has been the main entry point for vehicles accessing Capitol Square. Gate #1, as it now exists is inadequate and obsolete by today's security standards.

This project will address and correct this security inadequacy.

#### **Project Budget and Funding Sources:**

This project will be fully funded by the Commonwealth of Virginia. The Commonwealth's estimated project budget at this time is \$3M.

As part of this project, however, the Commonwealth would be looking to the City of Richmond to contribute certain items of work, at their expense, including but not limited to, dedications, easements, recordings, relocation of bus stops, relocation of traffic signals and signage, utility connection fees, vacation and/or relocation of utilities, etc.

#### **Description of Construction Program:**

The construction program will include but is not limited to, demolition, grading, new/relocation of utilities and traffic control measures, new curb, gutter and sidewalk work, bollards, new roadway pavement & striping, new landscaping, etc.

#### **Estimated Construction Start Date:**

Contingent on full approval and authorization of the Commonwealth's application by the City of Richmond no later than December 31, 2019

The Commonwealth estimates

- A Design Phase of January 2020 through August 2020
- A Construction Phase of September 2020 through August 2021

The Commonwealth of Virginia, Department of General Services (DGS) is submitting its design for safety and security improvements for Capitol Square's North Drive. This project is authorized in the 2019 Virginia Acts of Assembly, Chapter 854, Item C-1.10 <a href="https://budget.lis.virginia.gov/item/2019/1/hb1700/chapter/2/c-1.10/">https://budget.lis.virginia.gov/item/2019/1/hb1700/chapter/2/c-1.10/</a>. The design solution was developed jointly between DGS and the Virginia Division of Capitol Police (DCP), with input from the Virginia State Police Executive Protective Unit staff.

We believe the design presented to you provides needed operational safety and security improvements for visitors (pedestrians and vehicular) to Capitol Square; motorists traveling on 9<sup>th</sup> Street; City, DCP, and state police law enforcement; and occupants of the Capitol and Executive Mansion. DGS and DCP are interested in obtaining City of Richmond approval of a final design no later than December 2019, with an anticipated construction timeline beginning January 2020 and completed by August 2021.

Please accept this submittal for review and comments by appropriate City staff. I respectfully ask that City provide its comments to DGS no later than September 27, 2019. I request that you also provide the City of Richmond's requirements to obtain design and construction approval of the project no later than December 2019.






- 1. All gates are to be automated and controlled from guard house during business hours, and accessible via security card access during non- business hours.
