President Cynthia Newbille called the meeting to order at 6:25 p.m., and presided.

Invocation was offered by Reverend Katherine Todd of Forest Hill Presbyterian Church, 4401 Forest Hill Avenue, Richmond, VA.

Members of Council and the audience recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

## CHAMBER EMERGENCY EVACUATION PLAN AND CITIZEN SPEAKER GUIDELINES

Upon the President's request, Deputy City Clerk RJ Warren provided information on the appropriate manner in which the Council Chamber is to be evacuated in the event of an emergency along with citizen speaker guidelines.

There were no appointment/reappointment items for consideration.

## AWARDS AND PRESENTATIONS

There were no awards or presentations.

## **CITIZEN COMMENT**

**Louise Lockett Gordon** addressed Council concerning Richmond 300's efforts to update the city-wide master plan. She stated Richmond 300 will host open forums throughout October to share information of the draft master plan and provide an opportunity for citizen feedback.

**Myasia Goode** addressed Council regarding her desire to establish a community garden located at the intersection of Lone St. and Harwood St. She informed Council that Hillside Court lacks access to fresh fruit and vegetables, and her goal was to counter the issue by growing and providing produce at the local community center.

Councilor Ellen Robertson stated she would provide her contact information to Ms. Goode and assist her with the proposed community garden.

Vice President Chris Hilbert inquired about ways in which someone could donate to Ms. Goode's proposed community garden.

Ms. Goode stated supplies could be donated at the proposed location. She added interested individuals could contact her or Patrice Shelton, Hillside Recreational Center coordinator, regarding donations.

**Nancy Mitchell** addressed Council regarding her desire to promote the city as a southern destination for the entertainment industry. She noted Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) was recognized frequently as a top public arts school in the nation, and stated banners should be displayed throughout the city to raise awareness on the achievement.

President Cynthia Newbille asked that city administration follow-up with Ms. Mitchell to determine how to highlight the achievement.

**Brian Peyton** addressed Council and read a letter he sent Mayor Levar Stoney regarding the large presence of commercial vehicles and traffic on Maury St. He stated his concerns regarding the safety of residents and pedestrians within the location.

President Newbille thanked Mr. Peyton and expressed Council's concern for pedestrian safety. She asked that city administration follow-up with Mr. Peyton regarding the issue.

Councilwoman Reva Trammell stated she would speak with Mr. Peyton after the meeting regarding the matter.

Councilor Robertson stated she would like to work with Mr. Peyton on the issue and requested the Office of the City Clerk provide her with Mr. Peyton's contact information.

**Vilma Seymour** addressed Council on behalf of the Richmond Region Legion of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC). She stated LULAC was located at the Southside Community Center, where SAT preparation, computer literacy training and additional assistance are available to the Latino student community. Ms. Seymour also stated LULAC's goal was to increase the Latino student graduation rate within Richmond Public Schools.

Councilor Michael Jones commended Ms. Seymour and expressed his concerns for more transportation opportunities to increase access to the Southside Community Center.
