PURPOSE: To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) to execute agreement with the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) for \$200,000 in Federal Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) funding and \$50,000 in Commonwealth Transportation Funds for the continuation of the City of Richmond Employee Trip Reduction Program (ETRP).

REASON: The City of Richmond ETRP is funded from federal and state grant funds. The state funds provided by DRPT are used as a local match for CMAQ funds that fully fund the program.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Approval is recommended by the City Administration.

BACKGROUND: The ETRP began in January 2004 to encourage City employees to use alternative forms of transportation, in an effort to reduce the dependency on the automobile, reduce the demand for parking, and improve air quality. Since 2004, the City of Richmond has received CMAQ funds along with matching state funds provided by DRPT to fully fund the City of Richmond ETRP. The grant funding is used to finance the purchase of GRTC swipe cards, as well as vanpool vouchers for full-time City of Richmond employees for their commute to and from work. Approximately 913 City of Richmond Employees are enrolled in the program with approximately 303 active users. This program has reduced the vehicle miles traveled by 7,575 per day and resulting in a reduction of 14 tons of Hydrocarbons and 43 tons of Nitrous Oxide emissions per year.





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### Project Agreement for Use of Commonwealth Transportation Funds Fiscal Year 2019

## Six Year Improvement Program Approved Project Federal Highway Administration Grant Number CM 5A27 (661) Grant Number 47019-06

This Project Agreement ("Agreement"), effective June 11, 2019, by and between the Commonwealth of Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation ("Department") and the City of Richmond ("Grantee") (collectively, the "Parties"), is for the provision of funding for the City of Richmond's Employee Trip Reduction Program ("Project").

WHEREAS, on June 20, 2017, the Commonwealth Transportation Board ("CTB") allocated funding for the Project; and

WHEREAS, on June 11, 2019, the Federal Highway Administration ("FHWA") approved funding for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Department provides state matching funds to Federal funds for approved projects in the Six Year Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to define the extent of the Project, the responsibilities of each Party, the manner of performing the necessary Work, the method and time of payment, and to set out additional conditions associated with the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements set forth, and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

### ARTICLE 1. SCOPE OF WORK, TERM AND BUDGET

- 1. The Work to be performed by the Grantee under the terms of this Agreement is as follows:
  - a. Administer the City of Richmond's Employee Trip Reduction Program.
- 2. The Department agrees to provide funding as detailed below:
  - a. State grant funding in the amount of \$50,000 to match Federal funds for the Project approved in the Fiscal Year 2018 Six Year Improvement Program. Details concerning this funding are contained in Appendix 1, which is attached and made a part of this Agreement.
- 3. The Grantee acknowledges that state grant funding for this grant is subject to appropriation by the General Assembly of Virginia and allocation by the CTB.

# ARTICLE 2. INCORPORATION OF MASTER AGREEMENT FOR USE OF COMMONWEALTH FUNDS

The Parties agree to incorporate the Master Agreement for Use of Commonwealth Transportation Funds, dated December 13, 2012, as if set out in full herein.
