## **Administrative Impact Statement of Resolution No. 2019-067:**

The Safe and Healthy Streets Commission recommended on October 16, 2019, based upon a review by the Vision Zero Task Force on October 7, 2019, that City Council fund in FY 21 approximately \$3 million to accomplish the following Vision Zero priorities:

Two traffic enforcement units within RPD comprised of two police ser-
geants and eight officers for \$1.4 million;

Eight senior construction inspectors within DPW to monitor and enf	orce
work in street permits for \$844,000;	

<ul> <li>Six support officers for parking management to improve neighborhood safety for \$500,000;</li> </ul>
☐ Five technicians within DPW to maintain traffic safety assets for \$256,000;
The Commission further recommends that City Council fund in FY 22-25 approximately \$2.2 million annually to sustain these Vision Zero efforts through 2025.
<b>Fiscal Impact:</b> \$3 Million in General Fund for FY21. \$2.2 million annually for FY22-25.
