PURPOSE: To adopt a resolution to join the American Flood Coalition.

REASON: Description: The American Flood Coalition is a nonpartisan group of government, military, business, and local leaders that have come together to drive adaptation to the reality of higher seas, stronger storms, and more frequent flooding. The coalition seeks to advance national solutions that support flood-affected communities and protect our nation's residents, economy, and military installations.

The American Flood Coalition advocates for policy changes and practical national solutions to address the issues posed by rising seas and flooding which complement City of Richmond planning for environmental justice for citizens in flood prone areas, economic and community development and infrastructure resiliency as a tidal community with a major river within our downtown.

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt a resolution in the form used by other cities joining the American Flood Coalition

BACKGROUND: There are 175 American Flood Coalition members in 12 states. Virginia cities include Hampton and Virginia Beach. The mission and the needs of the city regarding flood issues are compatible and would be a fit for membership. Policy issues that could be addressed

with the Flood Coalition is the equitable expense of flood resiliency; the impact of flood insurance and flood proofing on properties; the cost of the Richmond community to maintain and renew the \$153,000,000 floodwall and levee system; convening conversations on climate change floodplain and dam safety with the Secretary of the Army, US Army Corps of Engineers and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency, and Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation along with the other current members of Virginia Beach and Hampton. City departments that may benefit from membership include public works, public utilities, parks and recreation, planning, economic development, social services, the offices of sustainability and risk management, housing, and community wealth building.

Joining the Network would support multiple city initiatives including: RVAgreen 2050, the city's equity-centered, integrated mitigation and adaptation planning; the city's climate resilience including its urban heat island work and urban tree canopy program; Richmond 300; and RVA H20.

WHEREAS, the Richmond community, operates and maintains a \$153,000,000 floodwall and levee system to provide river flood protection to important economic and residential portions of the city, enacted a stormwater utility in 2009 and annually funds that utility to address flooding issues throughout the city and that some citizens in Richmond must obtain federal flood insurance for their structures, the rates for such insurance is dependent on the City of Richmond proactively addressing flooding issues, and

WHEREAS, the City of Richmond finds that joining the American Flood Coalition will promote the welfare of Richmond residents and ensure the prosperity of the Richmond economy by accelerating solutions to sea level rise and flooding, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THE CITY OF RICHMOND:

Recognizes the need to advance national solutions to sea level rise and flooding and will work as a member of the American Flood Coalition to safeguard the welfare of all Richmond residents.
