The Department of Public Works has location monitoring unit (LMU/GPS) tracking devices installed on 74 pieces of equipment. The majority are those that are involved in the snow program-such as dump trucks, pick-up trucks, street sweepers and Solid Waste vehicles. Cal/Amp is the service provider.












How are we using the Technology?


The department is in its third year of a five year contract with Cal/Amp. During the first two years our focus has been primarily on the tracking and monitoring of vehicles used within the snow program. Current uses/features include:

- Geo Fencing
- Vehicle alerts
- Monitoring vehicle idle times
- Mileage reports





Program Costs






- Unit cost \$95 per unit (LMU-2630)
- Monthly hosting fee \$18.95 per device (\$1,383.35)
- Installation cost \$55 per unit



Program Successes

- Increased accountability
- Enhanced efficiency
- Real time monitoring
- Compliance with Traffic regulations







Next Steps

- 1. Increase the number of units installed from 74 300
- 2. Customized messaging
- 3. Add additional features such as Spreader controller, plow up/down sensors, real time data feeds for reporting tonnages
- 4. RFI driver idea
- 5. Increase efficiencies and accountability
- 6. Possible enterprise solution that meets the needs of all city agencies
