PURPOSE: To request City Council approval for the City of Richmond participating and supporting the proposed projects related to the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) Round 4 Smart Scale Program, and to authorize Chief Administrative Officer or designee, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute all necessary City/State agreements relating to the projects.

REASON: An approved Council Resolution indicating the Council's request for participation and support of the identified potential projects is required in order to participate in the VDOT Round 4 Smart Scale Program.

RECOMMENDATION: Department of Public Works recommends approval of this resolution.

BACKGROUND: The General Assembly has directed VDOT to establish several initiatives aimed at accelerating road construction and providing funding assistance for the improvements to their transportation system. One such initiative is the Smart Scale Program; under which the City

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of Richmond is eligible to apply for funding request of transportation projects. The City has successfully applied for these funds every year since the program's inception (previous three rounds).

A City council resolution in support of the proposed projects (attached) is required to participate in the program. This resolution will provide City Council authorization to participate in the program and authorize the CAO to execute all necessary City/State agreements required for participation if and when the projects are funded. A formal City/State agreement is required by VDOT before the City can begin design and construction of the approved projects. The program will provide for construction of certain eligible transportation projects within the City. This is 100% federal reimbursable program that requires no City match. If approved, project funding will be provided starting FY26/FY27. Smart Scale Round 4 is a biennial process.

Virginia's SMART SCALE (§33.2-21.4) is about picking the right transportation projects for funding and ensuring the best use of limited tax dollars. It is the method of scoring planned projects included in VTrans2040 (Commonwealth's long range transportation plan) that are funded by HB 1887. Transportation projects are scored based on an objective, outcome- based process that is transparent to the public and holds decision-makers accountable to the taxpayers. The City of Richmond can submit no more than a maximum of ten projects.

Projects are scored on technical criteria. For Central Virginia (including Richmond), criteria is – Safety 20%, Accessibility 25%, Congestion 15%, Economic Development 20%, Environmental Quality 10% and Land Use 10%. Once projects are scored and prioritized by VDOT, the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) has the best information possible to select the right projects for funding. More information about the SMART SCALE project prioritization process, including a technical guide for applicants, is available at www.vasmartscale.org.

VDOT's Smart Scale program has provided approximately \$143 million in the first three rounds of the program to the City (FY16 – approximately \$68 million for 9 projects and FY17 – approximately \$49 million for 6 projects, FY19 \$26 million for 7 projects). No city match is required; however, leveraged funds boost the ranking as the City projects compete with other jurisdictions in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Round 4 list of potential ten projects (attached) cost is estimated at \$90.1million (estimated cost may change after VDOT review and with the use of VDOT project estimate software)

The deadline to submit the City's applications to participate in the Round 4 Smart Scale Program is August 3, 2020. Pre-application is required to submit by April 2, 2020. VDOT will recommend candidate projects for public hearing in January 2021. CTB will adopt and fund projects in June 2021.

FISCAL IMPACT/COST TO CITY: None.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: Not participating in this program eliminates the possibility of receiving up to \$90.1 million estimated cost of these projects for these important transportation Capital Improvement Projects.

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BUDGET AMENDMENT NECESSARY: No.

REVENUE TO CITY: Approximately \$90.1 million estimated cost of the projects through FY26/FY27 if City projects are selected.
