## PURPOSE

To approve an exception to Sec 25-219 of the Subdivision Ordinance to waive the requirement for an average lot depth of not less than 100 feet.

#### **SUMMARY & RECOMMENDATION**

The applicant is proposing to record a subdivision plat establishing five residential lots, which are substantially in conformance with Special Use Permit Ord. No. 2020-016, but do not meet the standard of Sec. 25-219 of the Subdivision Ordinance which requires an average lot depth of not less than 100 feet. The proposed lot depth, substantially as shown on the adopted special use permit plans, is generally 61'. The applicant is therefore requesting, pursuant to Section 25-9 of the Subdivision Ordinance, an exception to Section 25-219 of the Subdivision Ordinance.

Staff finds that the proposed exception request would enable development that is substantially in conformance with the approved special use permit for the property and generally consistent with the historic pattern of development throughout the area.

Therefore, staff recommends approval of the exception request.

#### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

#### **Site Description**

The subject property consists of a parcel totaling 7,686 SF, or .18 acres, of land. The property is a part of the Fairmount neighborhood in the East Planning District. The development will consist of five single-family attached dwellings located on lots approximately 2,043 SF in area.

#### **Proposed Use of the Property**

The applicant intends to construct five single-family attached dwellings at 1121 N. 20<sup>th</sup> Street, which would front R Street.

# **Master Plan**

The City of Richmond's current Master Plan designates the subject property for Single Family Medium Density (SF-MD). Primary uses are single family and two family dwellings, both detached and attached, at densities of 8 to 20 units per acre. Includes residential support uses such as schools, places of worship, neighborhood parks and recreation facilities, and limited public and semi-public uses. Typical zoning classifications that may accommodate this land use category: R 5A, R-6 and R-7. The density of the proposed project is approximately 28 units per acre.

The Plan also states "Richmond neighborhoods will be recognized as safe, attractive and desirable places to live, work and raise families, while providing a variety of housing choices and homeownership opportunities." (p. 96).

Specifically for the East Planning District, the Master Plan states that "infill development of like density and use is appropriate" and "the predominant land uses in the District are residential in nature, and these uses should be preserved" (p. 166).

# Zoning

The property is located in the R-6 Single-Family Attached Residential District. The property is subject to Special Use Permit Ord. No. 2020-016, adopted February 10, 2020, which authorized up to five single-family attached dwellings.

# Surrounding Area

The property is a part of a larger R-6 District, with R-53 Multi-Family Residential and R-63 Multi-Family Residential Districts in close proximity to the west and south respectively. A mix of single, two-, and multi-family residential, commercial, institutional, and vacant land uses are present in the area. The majority of dwellings within the area are older dwellings located on small lots.

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
