What is the incident, issue, event materials

History

COVID19

- Originated in Wuhan China in December 2019
- Open food market
- Rapidly spread through China and by February had moved to 38 countries




COVID 19 Severity Models

From China patient populations

 80% of patients infected will present with mild symptoms. Able to be managed at home with rest, fluids and over the counter medicines like acetaminophen

- A smaller percentage (14%) will have more serious symptoms; may require hospitalization and supportive care
- A smaller percentage (5%) will have severe symptoms requiring intensive support



Corona Virus


COVID19 Updated 3/16 09:00 hrs.

- Globally more than 169K cases
- More than 109 Countries
- Resulting in more than 3800 deaths (1700 Healthcare workers)
- US 3774 Cases, 69 deaths
- VA 51 cases, 1 death



 Consistent and timely messaging (email, Twitter, Starnet, Posters, Flyers etc.)

 Ensure public safety and the general workforce have the necessary resources needed to perform essential tasks



Objectives (Part 2)

COVID19

Provide COOP training by COOP taskforce

Track all expenditures

 Using RAPIDS (timekeepers and other select staff to perform data entry)

Conduct COOP seminars in each council district

Conduct internal and external after action report

Our Plan

Executive Highlights

Realities/ Feasibilities for real world conditions

- Any actions we take will blunt the impact of this epidemic, not stop it.
- Reduce/discontinue face-to-face meetings (social distancing).
- Expect VDH and or IMT to make recommendations for cancelling business travel, closing schools, cancelling mass events, modifications to business operations.
- We have prepared materials to help capture cost associated with this event.
- We have supply chain / manufacturing shortages affecting our preparations.

Collaboration Plan

Coordination with Local, State and Federal Government

Delegated Authority to CV Incident Management Team (IMT)

- Central VA IMT What is it, how does it work?
 - Work to ensure all city agency leaders and political leaders understand the responsibilities and lines of authority which have been established.
 - Unified Command has:
 - Established the Objectives
 - Established Command and General Staff Positions
 - This includes Transportation, Schools (K-12 & Universities/Colleges), Justice Centers
- City and IMT will continue to coordinate and collaborate with VDH, CDC and the Central VA Healthcare Coalition

Initial Awareness Communication Strategy

Communication addressing what it is, and how they protect themselves

Internal

- Prepared & Published a Safety Bulletin on COVID19
 - Developing additional education materials in form of video for ease of use with a continued emphasis on what it is, how I am protected
- Focused Enhanced Facility Disinfection
 - Public Works Electrostatic Cleaning
 - Hand Sanitizers
 - Disinfectants for employee work stations

External

- Posters to all entrance/exit of city facilities
- Ensured widespread availability of hand sanitizer
- Working with Central VA IMT to collaborate with schools (K-12 and Colleges/Universities), long term care facilities, faith based groups, businesses

Employee Specific Communications

Specific Communication Strategies

OEM and Fire Lead Role

- Prepare and distribute COVID19 Specific Public Safety Bulletins (updated at least weekly, more often if needed)
- Established a single point of contact for employees via Starnet
- Developing targeted short clip videos for employees addressing just in time training
- Addressing Leave / Benefit policies in line with public health recommendations and employment best practices
 - How will I be paid, What if I am sick and have no leave?

Facility Disinfection Plan

General Workplace Hygiene

Health and Safety Officer Lead Role

- OSHA General Duty Clause to provide a safe and healthy workplace
- Continued emphasis on Non Pharmaceutical interventions as primary defense
- Public Works using electrostatic cleaner to perform enhanced disinfection
- Conducted citywide inventory of available EPA recognized disinfectants to ensure product availability for employee use
 - Bridged any reported gaps in product availability
- Working with HR to ensure "sick stays home sick"
- Maintain personal protective equipment for high risk employee groups

HR Related Practices/Policies

Pay/Benefit Questions which require policy changes

HR Lead Role with input from Safety Officer

- CDC and VDH continue to emphasize liberal leave policies
 - Admin leave up to 10 days
 - Pending Federal Legislation requiring employers to provide paid sick leave
- Pay associated with sick leave, medical quarantines
 - Emerging literature is guiding our efforts
- Workers Compensation benefits
 - Prepared materials for distribution to supervisors/managers, City Safety Officers, Payroll and time keepers

IT Specific

Remote work site operations

OEM and DIT

- In the process of establishing count of 'Essential/Critical' personnel by department
 - VPN accounts are being expanded
 - City connectivity assets are being distributed
- DIT Director released specific guidance to department directors with a checklist of items commonly overlooked
- Directors have been tasked with ensuring complete and accurate telephone contact for all department personnel (home, cellular)

Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP)

How we will conduct business in event of closure, modifications to business sites/hours

OEM Lead

- All essential agencies have a COOP plan and are actively reviewing with OEM to ensure the following are identified:
 - An alternate facility
 - Critical (essential) department functions
 - Delegations of authority and orders of succession
- Beginning January 2019 workshops have been conducted that include exercising a department COOP
 - 76% of all agencies have attended this training
 - Training is ongoing

Ongoing Action Items

Rapid and Dynamic developing situation

OEM and Fire Lead

- Continued employee education
- Provide messaging to Mayor for dissemination (SitRep, CAN)
- Message saturation strategy (SitRep, CAN)
- Partial activation of the Richmond City Emergency Operations center (EOC)
 - RFD, RFD, DEC, DIT, RSO, Health, RAA, Finance, HR, JIC
- Daily FAQ's posted on City's website: www.richmondgov.com/covid19

Ongoing Action Items Cont'd

Rapid and Dynamic developing situation

OEM and Fire Lead

- SharePoint link established for leadership questions to provide direct feedback
- Procurement of supplies/resources
- COOP Taskforce
- Confirmed cases provided by VDH
- Ongoing operations in concert with CDC guidelines and recommendations
