PURPOSE

To use creative ways to promote awareness of storm water drains and their relationship to water quality in the James River (per Section 17.05 of the City Charter)

SUMMARY & RECOMMENDATION

The city of Richmond's Storm Water Utility MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System) program is responsible for educating citizens about storm water and the harmful effects of pollution, bacteria and unwanted nutrients in the rainwater runoff. Temporary murals on storm water drains is one of several annual programs undertaken to enhance public awareness of the City's efforts to help everyone adopt clean storm water habits.

Participants are given a small stipend (\$400) for their work. More information can be found on the city's website RVAH20.org. DPU will be responsible for the installation and maintenance of the murals.
