#### **AWARDS AND PRESENTATIONS**

Vice President Chris Hilbert, on behalf of Richmond City Council, recognized and honored Prince-Albert William Hudson, IV, a student at Barack Obama Elementary School, for his many scholastic and extracurricular accomplishments.

Vice President Chris Hilbert on behalf of Richmond City Council, recognized and honored President Cynthia Newbille on her ten years of service as a Council representative.

Mayor Levar Stoney addressed Council and provided an introduction of the Office of Community Wealth Building's (OCWB) annual performance report presentation.

Valaryee N. Mitchell, OCWB director, provided Council with an overview of OCWB's annual performance report and an update on the city's progress in the implementation of the comprehensive poverty reduction strategy.

A copy of the material provided has been filed.

Victoria Allen and Jordan Walker, Mayor's Youth Academy participants, addressed Council and shared their experiences participating in the Mayor's Youth Academy program.

Councilor Kim Gray inquired why city administration requested that Rhonda Sneed, Blessing Warriors founder, calculate the number of individuals residing in "Camp Cathy", an encampment of tents providing shelter outside the city's cold weather overflow shelter at the Annie Giles Community Resource Center, rather than have city staff calculate the number.

Reginald Gordon, deputy chief administrative officer for human services, provided information regarding efforts to collect information of individuals residing in "Camp Cathy" and addressed the plan moving forward to provide shelter and services for the individuals. Mr. Gordon stated additional individuals were arriving from other localities which complicated efforts to compile data. Mr. Gordon requested that the task force consisting of service providers and city administration staff be scheduled to provide an update on the situation at a future meeting of Council.

Councilor Stephanie Lynch suggested that the city partner with a service provider and create a source of funding to provide permanent housing and services for homeless individuals.

Sharon Ebert, deputy chief administrative officer for economic and community development, stated city administration was receptive to Councilor Lynch's suggestion to partner with a service provider to fund and provide permanent housing.

Councilor Kristen Larson informed members that the issues associated with "Camp Cathy" were addressed at the Thursday, March 5, 2020, Education and Human Services Committee meeting. Councilor Larson expressed her concern with the lack of dialogue between the task force and Council. Councilor Larson requested that a member of Council's staff join the task force addressing efforts to provide shelter and services, so Council would have more direct information and involvement.

Councilor Ellen Robertson stated city administration provided Council with an action plan to address homelessness and was awaiting recommendations from Council before submitting the final action plan for adoption. Councilor Robertson suggested a timeline be established to compile and submit recommendations to city administration.

Councilwoman Reva Trammell inquired about plans for the Hickory Hill Community Center.

Valaryee Mitchell stated OCWB was interested in using the facility to provide services for the community and was actively working with the Parks, Recreation & Community Facilities department regarding efforts.

#### CITIZEN COMMENT

**Selden Richardson** addressed Council and provided photographs of the former Westham Train Station building currently owned by the city. Mr. Richardson expressed his concerns with the building's condition and inquired about the city's efforts to protect the building from ruin.

A copy of the material provided has been filed.

Councilor Kim Gray stated she was in dialogue with city administration regarding efforts to address the building, in addition to other historically significant city owned buildings.

Lenora Reid, Acting Chief Administrative Officer, stated information will be provided to Council regarding the former Westham Train Station building.

Vice President Chris Hilbert addressed surplus property owned by Richmond Public Schools (RPS) and the process for selling the surplus property. Vice President Hilbert stated the RPS school board established a subcommittee to facilitate the sale of surplus property and inquired about the subcommittee's meeting schedule.

Councilor Kristen Larson stated she would contact the RPS school board to obtain additional information about meetings of the subcommittee.

**Heather Holub, Carytown business owner,** addressed Council regarding beautification efforts in Carytown and shared positive accounts of city tourists visiting Carytown. Ms. Holub requested Council fund beautification efforts in Carytown.

President Cynthia Newbille requested city administration follow up with Ms. Holub regarding beautification efforts in tourist destinations throughout the city.
