I'm writing to express Urban Hope's support for The Maggie Walker Community Land Trust to subdivide the property at 1701 N 21st Street and build two attached, single family homes. The Community Land Trust's primary purpose is to provide permanently affordable homes for residents of the Richmond Metro Region. This mission continues to be one of great importance, particularly in the neighborhood of this proposed project. Longtime residents of Church Hill face ever-growing real estate prices and ongoing speculative investment practices which threaten their ability to stay in the neighborhood that they have called home. The development and preservation of quality affordable housing, particularly permanently affordable housing, which preserves affordability for generations, is paramount to the future of this neighborhood.
