- § 2. That (i) section III(B)(29) of the Pay Plan shall not apply to the amendments made by section 1 of this ordinance, (ii) no employee whose position this ordinance moves to another classification, pay range, or pay band shall receive a pay increase or decrease due to any adjustment made by this ordinance, and (iii) for purposes of this section, words or phrases defined in section III(A) of the Pay Plan have the meanings set forth in section III(A) of the Pay Plan.
 - § 3. That section II(B) of the Pay Plan be and is hereby amended as follows:
 - B. The provisions of this section II(B) apply to the fiscal year commencing July 1, [2019] 2020, and ending June 30, [2020] 2021.

 All employees in classified and unclassified City permanent positions shall have their base rate of pay adjusted to reflect a [three] two percent increase, subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. Employees not employed continuously in a permanent position on June 30, [2018] 2019, shall not be eligible for a base rate of pay adjustment except as indicated in section II(B)(4).
 - 2. Employees in the classifications of Police Recruit, Police Officer I, Police Officer II, Police Officer III, Police Officer IV, Master Police Officer, Police Sergeant, Police Lieutenant, Police Captain, Fire Recruit, Fire Fighter I, Fire Fighter II, Fire Fighter IV, Master Fire Fighter, <u>Driver Pump Operator</u>, Fire Lieutenant, Fire Captain, Fire Battalion Chief, Staff Battalion Chief, and any other employee in the step based pay system for which Section III(40) provides shall not be eligible for the [three] two percent increase in base rate of pay.
 - 3. If, as a result of the application of the [three] two percent increase to an employee's base rate of pay for which this section II(B)(1) provides, an employee's base rate of pay would exceed the maximum rate of pay for that employee's classification, (i) that employee's base rate of pay shall be increased only to the maximum rate of pay for that employee's classification, and (ii) that employee shall not be eligible for additional increases to that employee's base rate of pay until the maximum rate of pay for that employee's classification pursuant to section I is adjusted to exceed such employee's base rate of pay.
 - 4. If, after the application of the two percent increase, an employee's base rate of pay is below an employee's minimum rate of pay for that employee's classification, that employee's base rate of pay shall increase to the minimum of that employee's classification.

- 5. The amount of the increase shall be calculated on the employee's base rate of pay as of July [5, 2019] 3, 2020.
- [5. For the avoidance of doubt, constitutional officers and their employees who do not have classifications or titles set forth in the "Classifications and Assigned Ranges," dated January 5, 2019, shall receive the three percent increase if they meet the other requirements of this section II(B).]"

Economic Development Authority ("EDA") to be used by the EDA to finance capital expenditures or to make loans or grants to finance capital expenditures for the purposes of promoting economic development; to authorize the Director of Finance, with the approval of the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City, to sell such bonds for such capital improvement projects, to provide for the form, details and payment of such bonds; to authorize the issuance of notes of the City in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds; and to authorize the issuance of taxable bonds, for the same purposes and uses, in the same maximum principal amount and payable over the same period as such general obligation public improvement bonds.

ORD. 2020-069

To authorize the issuance of general obligation public improvement bonds of the City of Richmond in the maximum principal amount of \$9,976,000 to finance the cost of capital improvement projects of the stormwater utility of the City for the following purposes and uses: replacement of and upgrades to the stormwater facilities, including but not limited to, construction, reconstruction, improvements, rehabilitation and upgrades of stormwater sewers and associated facilities; new and replacement infrastructure of the storm sewer system, drainage structures, catch basins, ditches, storm sewer pipes, culverts, green infrastructure; acquisition of real property therefor as appropriate; and equipment for various infrastructure needs; and authorizes the Director of Finance, with the approval of the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City, to sell such bonds for such capital improvement projects, to provide for the form, details and payment of such bonds and to authorize the issuance of notes of the City in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds, and to authorize the issuance of taxable bonds, for the same purposes and uses, in the same maximum principal amount and payable over the same period as such general obligation public improvement bonds.

ORD. 2020-070

To cancel all authorized but unissued notes authorized by the City of Richmond in Fiscal Years 2016-2017 and 2017-2018, to authorize the issuance of general obligation equipment notes of the City of Richmond in the maximum principal amount of \$4,867,332 to finance the cost of equipment for the following purposes and uses: acquisition of computer, radio, office, solid waste collection, office furniture and miscellaneous equipment and vehicles for the various departments, bureaus and agencies of the City, and equipment for City schools; and to authorize the Director of Finance, with the approval of the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City, to sell equipment notes to finance the acquisition of such equipment, and to authorize the issuance of taxable notes, for the same purposes and uses, in the same maximum principal amount and payable over the same period as such general obligation equipment notes.

ORD. 2020-071

To cancel all authorized but unissued bonds authorized by the City of Richmond in Fiscal Years 2016-2017, to authorize the issuance of public utility revenue bonds of the City of Richmond in the maximum principal amount of \$103,007,500 to finance the cost of capital improvement projects of the gas, water and wastewater utilities and public utilities buildings and facilities for the following purposes and uses: enlargement, extension, repair, replacement, improvement and equipping of the gas plant and transmission lines; enlargement, extension, repair, replacement, improvement and equipping of the waterworks plant and transmission lines; enlargement, extension, repair, replacement, improvement and equipping of the wastewater plant and intercepting lines; construction, reconstruction, repair, replacement, and improvement of sanitary and storm water sewers, pumping stations, drains and culverts; construction, reconstruction, repair, replacement, improvement and equipping of public utility buildings and facilities therefor, including but not limited to the stores division; and acquisition of real property and real property rights (including without limitation easements and rights-of-way) therefor as appropriate; to authorize the Director of Finance. with the approval of the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City, to sell such bonds for such capital improvement projects; to provide for the form, details and payment of such bonds; to approve the form of supplemental indenture of trust; to authorize the issuance of notes of the City in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds; and to authorize the issuance of taxable bonds, for the

same purposes and uses, in the same maximum principal amount and payable over the same period as such public utility revenue bonds.

ORD. 2020-072

To amend Appendix A of the City Code by increasing the fee for section 4-307, concerning the annual fee for a breeding permit, per dog or cat.

REVIEW OF RESPONSES TO THE APRIL 13, 2020 BUDGET WORK SESSION QUESTIONS AND COUNCIL DISCUSSION REGARDING NEXT STEPS

Council Budget Analyst Bill Echelberger provided Council with an overview of questions proposed by Council at the April 13, 2020 Budget Work Session and responses provided by city administration.

Councilor Kim Gray expressed her concerns regarding proposed figures put forth by city administration and stated city administration did not incorporate the full potential impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic.

Councilor Kristen Larson requested members put forth a Council priorities list regarding budget-related cuts and distribution of surpluses.

Lincoln Saunders, Office of the Mayor chief of staff, provided Council with additional information regarding Greater Richmond Transit Company (GRTC) funding. Mr. Saunders stated city administration was still awaiting direction from the Commonwealth of Virginia and United States government, regarding distribution of funds provided by the CARES Act.

President Cynthia Newbille requested Council staff coordinate with city administration to provide Council with monthly updates regarding the city's budget and revenue figures, in addition to any potential amendments necessary to address the city's budget.

Acting Chief Administrative Officer Lenora Reid provided Council with information regarding the city's tax amnesty program, and options available to citizens related to the city's real estate tax and personal property tax.

President Newbille requested city administration provide an update regarding funding to address homelessness in the city at the April 27, 2020 Council Budget Work Session.

Councilor Larson requested Richmond Public Schools (RPS) provide an update at the April 27, 2020 Council Budget Work Session regarding the COVID-19 Pandemic's impact on RPS funding.

It was the consensus of Council to cancel the Wednesday, April 22, 2020 Council Budget Work Session.
