I am an Assistant Professor at VCU directing a medical research program worth in excess of \$5.2M. This position involves directing my staff to work with laboratory animals developing drugs that will ultimately improve the quality of life for humans with diseases and traumatic injuries. As part of my Professional duties I am also a member of VCU's Animal Care and Welfare Program (ACUP) that is designed to ensure all animal research is performed in compliance with State and Federal regulations, which involves participation in our annual inspections of VCU animal laboratory and housing facilities.

I live at 7344 Longview Drive, Richmond VA 23225 and I am a direct neighbor of Ms. Patricia DeZern, who lives at 7345 Longview Drive, Richmond VA 23225. Our end of Longview Drive is a very woodsy area, with large lot sizes (averaging ~1 acre each), which connect to the James River Park "Pony Pasture" and "Wetlands" areas. There is an extensive wildlife population in our immediate and surrounding areas, and members of our community, including Patricia, are heavily involved in protecting the James River Park and surrounding areas from urban threats, including highway expansions and increased vehicular traffic.
