Patrons request that legislation be drafted expressing Council's support of safety recommendations in DPW's study of the intersection Jahnke Road and German School				

Patrons have called for safety improvements in the intersection's vicinity after in auto accident there led to the death of 16 year old Aajah Rosemond last October.

DPW Traffic Study Recommendations include:

Road.

1) use of grant monies from the Department of Motor Vehicles that would allow leasing

and installation of photo speed cameras for vehicles going 11 mph over the posted speed limit in school zones and the levying of \$100 speeding fines for speeding vehicles; and

2) deployment of photo speed cameras and when school is session in conjunction with the Police Department's speed trailer to raise awareness of speed limits and their variable message signs to encourage safety.

BACKGROUND

Patrons called for studies to improve roadway safety in light of the traffic accident that lead to the death of Aajah Rosemond last October near the German School Road and Jahnke Road intersection. It is hoped that these safety improvements will save lives and prevent serious injuries, prevent crashes, prevent death and injury in the future by managing speed.

German School Road at Jahnke Road

Summary of Actions to Date

Over the past several years, DPW has installed the following safety countermeasures to improve the intersection of German School Road and Jahnke Road:

- High visibility crosswalks
- Pedestrian countdown signals with push buttons
- Adjusted pedestrian crossing times for all users
- Calculated and checked yellow and red clearance intervals
- 90 degree mast arms with signal heads positioned over each lane with backplates
- Accessible curb ramps to meet ADA requirements
- Lane control arrows
- Extended bike lanes on German School road
- Worked with developer of Westlake to include a complete street extension with sidewalks.

There are photos below that show the intersection in 2016 compared to the improvements shown in 2020.

Most recently, DPW resurfaced Jahnke Road and reduced the lane widths to better manage speeds and allow for the inclusion of bike lanes on Jahnke Road from Hioaks Road to Blakemore Road.

Further Recommendations

Future plans by RPD could include using newly passed legislation to levy \$50 speeding fines using photo speed cameras for vehicles going 11MPH or over the posted speed in school zones. Here is a list of five schools on the high injury street network:

- Westover Hills Elementary on Forest Hill Avenue and Jahnke road (25MPH)
- River City Middle School on Hull Street, Elkhardt Road, and Whitehead Road (35MPH to 25MPH)
- George Wythe High School on Midlothian Turnpike and Crutchfield Road (35MPH to 25MPH)
- Patrick Henry Elementary School on Forest Hill Avenue and Semmes Avenue (30MPH to 25MPH)
- Holton Elementary School on Hermitage Road and Laburnum Avenue (35MPH to 25MPH)

The City of Richmond has received notification over this past summer that we are the selected pilot city for the country to demonstrate an effective speed management pilot. We are currently working through the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles (grantee) and our partners at the Governor's Highway Safety Association (GHSA), the Insurance Institute of Highway Safety (IIHS) and the National Roadway Safety Foundation (NRSF) on how to potentially deploy photo speed cameras in select school zones within the City limits. We are awaiting schools to return to in-person learning; hopefully, Fall 2021.

When schools are back in session, the photo speed camera deployment could be used in conjunction with RPD deploying their speed trailer for approximately two weeks to raise awareness of the speed limits in the area as well as their variable message signs to encourage safer behaviors.

Finally, an important shared use path, medians, turn lanes, sidewalks, pedestrian countdown signals will be constructed on Jahnke Road connecting Westover Hills Elementary School to Lucille Brown Middle School. Currently, the utilities are being relocated such that a contractor can make the improvements.
