WHEREAS, the Richmond 300 Advisory Council was established in accordance with sections 2-793 through 2-799 of the Code of the City of Richmond as an ad-hoc committee of the Richmond City Planning Commission and was tasked with advising the Planning Commission and the Department of Planning and Development Review (PDR) in the development of the city-wide Master Plan Update, *Richmond 300: A Guide for Growth*; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Richmond 300 Advisory Council represented a diversity of Richmonders and included individuals with expertise in planning, real estate, architecture, historic preservation, urban design, and law, as well as community members who were experts in their communities; and
