WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 88-155-144, adopted June 13, 1988, the City of Richmond authorized the conveyance by deed of gift to the Commonwealth of Virginia, on behalf of Virginia Commonwealth University, of the City-owned property being the triangular parcel bounded by Grove Avenue, North Harrison Street, and Park Avenue in the city of Richmond, and known as "Howitzer Park" (hereinafter referred to as "Howitzer Park"); and

WHERERAS, upon information and belief of the Council, Howitzer Park derived its name from the Howitzer Monument, which consisted of a statue and pedestal, erected in 1892 in honor of the Richmond Howitzers, an artillery unit mustered into the service of the Confederate States of America and serving for the duration of the American Civil War; and

WHEREAS, the conveyance of Howitzer Park to the Commonwealth of Virginia, on behalf of Virginia Commonwealth University, authorized by Ordinance No. 88-155-144, adopted June 13, 1988, was conditioned, in part, on the requirement that if either the City of Richmond or Virginia Commonwealth University desired to remove and relocate the Howitzer Monument, such relocation could be undertaken only by mutual consent of the parties and at the expense of the requesting party; and

WHEREAS, the statue of the Howitzer Monument was toppled from its pedestal as a result of vandalism in 2020; and

WHEREAS, upon information and belief of the Council, Virginia Commonwealth University has requested the City's consent to Virginia Commonwealth University's plan for the removal and relocation of the Howitzer Monument; and

WHEREAS, upon information and belief of the Council, Virginia Commonwealth University has satisfied all of its obligations regarding Howitzer Park and removal of the Howitzer Monument further satisfies Virginia Commonwealth University's obligations with respect to Howitzer Park and the Howitzer Monument; and

WHEREAS, upon information and belief of the Council, in removing the Howitzer Monument, Virginia Commonwealth University will continue to maintain Howitzer Park as a park; and

WHEREAS, upon information and belief of the Council, Virginia Commonwealth University will continue to be responsible for the maintenance, repair, and upkeep of the Howitzer Monument; and

WHEREAS, the Council consents to Virginia Commonwealth University's transfer of ownership of the Howitzer Monument to another party after its removal from Howitzer Park; and

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WHEREAS, the Council believes that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Richmond that the Council consent to Virginia Commonwealth University's plan for the removal and relocation of the Howitzer Monument;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND:

That the Council hereby consents to Virginia Commonwealth University's plan for the removal and relocation of the Howitzer Monument.

ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY

Patron requests that legislation be drafted for Council's consideration granting the City's consent to remove the monument to the Richmond Howitzers to Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU).

The City and VCU are parties to a 1989 Agreement and Deed of Gift from the City to VCU which grants the VCU the Richmond Howitzers Monument and the parcel it is located on near the intersection of Park Avenue, Grove Avenue, and Harrison Street at VCU's Monroe Park Campus (Deed dated June 26, 1989, Ord No. 88-155-144).

The Agreement requires maintenance of the parcel and the Howitzers' Monument. The Agreement also requires the City's consent to removal of the Monument.

BACKGROUND

The Richmond Howitzers Monument was erected in 1892 and honors the fallen artillerymen of the unit who fought in the Civil War. The Richmond Howitzers were organized in 1859, were mustered into confederate service when Virginia seceded from the Union and fought throughout the War and was present for the surrender at Appomattox. The Howitzers' unit reorganized after the Civil War as part of the Virginia Militia and saw service in both World Wars I and II. VCU has decided to remove markers and monuments on its campuses honoring confederate servicemen and leaders, including the Howitzers Monument and requests the City's concurrence in removing as required by the 1989 Agreement and Deed between the City and VCU.

VCU will bear the burden of all costs in removing the monument and retain ownership of it, and bear all costs of maintenance and upkeep of the monument. VCU will continue to maintain the real property as a park.

RECITAL

This conveyance is exempt from recordation taxes pursuant to Section 58.1-811(A)(3) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City of Richmond wishes to convey by gift to the Commonwealth of Virginia certain real property identified herein, for the use and benefit of Virginia Commonwealth University; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Richmond, by duly enacted ordinance (Ordinance No. 88-155-144, adopted June 13, 1988), has authorized the conveyance of such property upon specified terms and conditions; and

WHEREAS, by execution of this Agreement and Deed, Virginia Commonwealth University represents that the conveyance of the property upon the terms and conditions specified is acceptable to the Governor of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, this conveyance by gift is undertaken in accordance with and pursuant to the authority granted under Section 15.1-22 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual benefits to the parties hereto, it is agreed as follows:

1. The City of Richmond hereby grants and conveys unto the Commonwealth of Virginia, for the benefit and use of Virginia Commonwealth University, the following described property:

> ALL that certain piece or parcel of land containing 6,280 square feet, more or less, shown shaded on Department of Public Works Drawing No. N-21856, dated May 6, 1988, and entitled: "Proposed Conveyance of City Owned Surplus Property at the Intersection of Grove Avenue, Harrison Street and Park Avenue", such property being the triangular parcel of land more commonly known as "Howitzer Park", and being more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point, said point being the intersection of the northerly right of way line of Grove Avenue and the southerly right of way line of Park Avenue; thence in a westerly direction along the northerly right of way line of Grove Avenue a distance of one hundred seventy-seven and eighty-four hundredths feet (177.84') to a point and intersecting with the easterly right of way line of Harrison Street; thence in a northeasterly direction along the easterly right of way line of Harrison Street a distance of seventy-nine and fourteen hundredths feet (79.14') to a point and intersecting with the southerly right of way line of Park Avenue; thence in an easterly direction along the southerly right of way line of Park Avenue a distance of one hundred fifty-eight and seventy hundredths feet (158.70') to the point of BEGINNING.

2. Virginia Commonwealth University shall preserve and maintain the donated real estate in keeping with its intended use as a park.

3. Virginia Commonwealth University shall obtain the approval of the City, through its appropriate review procedures, before undertaking any improvement of the donated real estate.

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4. Virginia Commonwealth University shall provide for the maintenance, repair, and general upkeep of the monument known as"The Howitzer Statue", located on the donated real estate.

5. If either the City or Virginia Commonwealth University desires to remove and relocate the Howitzer Statue, such relocation may be undertaken only with mutual consent of the parties and at the expense of the requesting party.

6. In the event that Virginia Commonwealth University fails to put the donated real estate to its intended use as a park, or otherwise fails to satisfy its obligations with regard to the real estate and the monument located thereon, title to the property with all improvements thereon shall immediately vest in the City of Richmond; and the Commonwealth of Virginia, by its duly authorized officer, shall make, execute and deliver a general warranty deed conveying the unencumbered and marketable title of said property to the City of Richmond or to its designee.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this Agreement and Deed to be executed by their duly authorized representatives.

At its meeting of June 6, 1988, the City Planning Commission voted (5-0-1 abstention) to recommend APPROVAL of:

Ordinance No. 88-155

To declare as surplus and authorize the conveyance of certain City-owned real estate by deed of gift to the Commonwealth of Virginia, such real estate being the triangular parcel of land bounded by Grove Avenue, Harrison Street, and Park Avenue *** upon certain terms and conditions, and subject to written advice from the Governor of Virginia that such gift is acceptable.

The subject ordinance declares surplus and authorizes conveyance of the City-owned triangular parcel known as Howitzer Park bounded by Harrison Street and Park and Grove Avenues. The park would be conveyed as a gift to the Commonwealth of Virginia on behalf of Virginia Commonwealth University. The park lies to the east of Harrison Street within the V.C.U. campus. It contains approximately 6300 square feet of land and is the site of the Howitzer Statue. V.C.U. has requested the conveyance in order to officially incorporate the park into its campus as part of its environmental improvement plan. V.C.U. would be responsible for maintenance of the park, as well as upkeep of the statue. The Commission urged that V.C.U. work with the City's Statuary Committee regarding maintenance and upkeep of the statue. The park would continue to be accessible to the general public. The ordinance requires that the land continue to be used as a park, and that the monument be relocated or removed only with the mutual consent of the City and V.C.U. It also provides that any improvements to the park be approved by the City. The ordinance contains a condition that the land shall revert to the City if any of its provisions are not satisfied.

THE CITY OF RICHMOND HEREBY ORDAINS:

§ 1. That certain real estate owned by the City of Richmond, being the triangular parcel of land bounded by Grove Avenue, Harrison Street, and Park Avenue and commonly known as "Howitzer Park," containing 6,280 square feet, more or less, as shown shaded on Department of Public Works Drawing No. N-21856, dated May 6, 1988, entitled: "Proposed Conveyance of City Owned Surplus Property at the Intersection of Grove Avenue, Harrison Street and Park Avenue", is hereby declared surplus and is authorized to be conveyed by deed of gift to the Commonwealth of Virginia, on behalf of Virginia Commonwealth University, pursuant to Section 15.1-22 of the Code of Virginia, and in accordance with Section 12-206, et seq. of the Code of the City of Richmond, 1985. The conveyance shall be made subject to, and the deed of gift shall incorporate, conditions substantially in the form listed hereafter:

A. Virginia Commonwealth University shall preserve and maintain the donated real estate in keeping with its intended use as a park.

B. Virginia Commonwealth University shall obtain the approval of the City, through its appropriate review procedures, before undertaking any improvement of the donated real estate.

C. Virginia Commonwealth University shall provide for the maintenance, repair, and general upkeep of the monument known as "The Howitzer Statue", located on the donated real estate.

D. If either the City or Virginia Commonwealth University desires to remove and relocate the Howitzer Statue, such relocation may be undertaken only with mutual consent of the parties and at the expense of the requesting party.




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§ 2. 



