Council President Cynthia Newbille called the meeting to order at 6:11 p.m., and presided.

ELECTRONIC MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT

City Clerk Candice Reid, in accordance with Ordinance No. 2020-093, adopted April 9, 2020, as most recently amended by Ordinance No. 2020-232, adopted December 14, 2020, announced the meeting would be held through electronic communication means. City Clerk Reid stated notice of the meeting was provided to the public through a public information advisory issued on January 13, 2021, and through Legistar on the city website in accordance with usual practice. She also stated members of the public were encouraged to provide comments in writing prior to the meeting and all comments received prior to 10:00 a.m., on Monday, January 25, 2021, were provided to Council members. Ms. Reid indicated that members of the public who signed up to speak and provide comment would be called to speak at the appropriate time.

Invocation was offered by Pastor Ralph Hodge of Second Baptist Church Southside, 3300 Broad Rock Boulevard, Richmond, VA.

Members of Council and the audience recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Cynthia Newbille requested a moment of silence in memory of Sheila Mandt.

CITIZEN SPEAKER GUIDELINES

Upon the President's request, Deputy City Clerk RJ Warren provided citizen speaker guidelines.

Councilor Kristen Larson joined the meeting at 6:18 p.m.

CITIZEN COMMENT

Aaron Kemmerer addressed Council and stated members needed to do more to provide emergency shelter services in the city. Mr. Kemmerer also stated immediate action was necessary by Council to deliver adequate funding to provide a sufficient number of hotel rooms for homeless individuals in need of emergency shelter.

Kevin Cianfarini addressed Council and stated his concerns with the lack of recycling options within apartment complexes in the city. Mr. Cianfarini informed Council that many complexes do not offer recycling, and that most items that could be recycled are discarded into trash receptacles. Mr. Cianfarini expressed his concerns that with the development of new apartment complexes to address the city's housing needs, waste will continue to increase, and that recycling must be provided to counter that.

Pixie E. Curry addressed Council and stated her concerns with the lack of sidewalks in her neighborhood near Hopkins Road in the 8th Voter District. Ms. Curry also stated additional sidewalks were necessary to ensure the safety of pedestrians. Ms. Curry further stated her concerns with the amount of displaced trash throughout her neighborhood.

Troy King addressed Council and informed members about the job training he received with the Laborers' International Union of North America (LIUNA), which helped him acquire a job in the city. Mr. King stated Virginia law made it difficult for unions to train and support potential laborers. Mr. King also stated that if unions were provided more opportunities to assist the city's work force, then the rate of crime and homelessness in the city would decrease.

Councilwoman Reva Trammell stated she had requested additional trash receptacles be placed in areas referenced by Pixie E. Curry, and that she would inquire with the Department of Public Works regarding the lack of sidewalks that Ms. Curry addressed.

Councilor Ann-Frances Lambert informed members that she would vote to adopt ORD. 2020-249, but wanted to state that she was against spot zoning and had concerns about the proposed ordinance. Ms. Lambert also stated she wanted rezoning to be more compliant with the city's master plan.

Councilor Stephanie Lynch stated her support for ORD. 2020-260, and she provided additional information regarding Larry Jerome Bland and his impact on communities in the city.

Councilor Kristen Larson requested that city administration provide additional information regarding ORD. 2021-001.

Acting Chief Administrative Officer Lincoln Saunders informed members that city administration would increase promotion of the tax amnesty program referenced in ORD. 2021-001, and would also provide additional information regarding the program on the city's website and through informational flyers.

Councilor Lambert stated her support for ORD. 2020-260.

President Cynthia Newbille requested to be added as a co-patron of ORD. 2020-260.

Vice President Ellen Robertson requested to be added as a co-patron of ORD. 2021-001.

There were no further comments or discussions and the **Consent Agenda was** unanimously adopted.

Councilor Kristen Larson stated her appreciation of Joyce L. Davis for accepting the role of Interim Council Chief of Staff, and also shared her appreciation of Meghan Brown for previously serving in the role of Interim Council Chief of Staff.

Councilor Ann-Frances Lambert requested to be added as a co-patron of ORD. 2020-256, and stated she would work to make sure the Participatory Budgeting Steering Commission would be composed equitably.

President Cynthia Newbille stated her appreciation of Meghan Brown for previously serving as Interim Council Chief of Staff, and also expressed her appreciation of Joyce L. Davis for accepting the role of Interim Council Chief of Staff.

There were no further comments or discussions and **RES. 2021-R011 was unanimously adopted**.

Councilor Andreas Addison moved to expedite consideration of the following resolution, which was seconded and unanimously approved:

RES. 2021-R012

To encourage the School Board of the City of Richmond to plant a tree in memory of Aajah Rosemond at Thomas C. Boushall Middle School.

Councilor Michael Jones provided an introduction of RES. 2021-R012, and provided additional information regarding Aajah Rosemond and the need for improved pedestrian safety in the city.

Public Hearing

Yesmine Bethea spoke in support of RES. 2021-R012, and stated she was speaking in honor of her granddaughter, Aajah Rosemond, who died as a result of being a pedestrian struck by a vehicle at the intersection of German School Road and Jahnke Road. Ms. Bethea expressed her appreciation for the introduction of the proposed resolution and the efforts made to increase pedestrian safety.

Councilor Kristen Larson requested to be added as a co-patron of RES. 2021-R012. Councilor Larson also requested to be added as a co-patron of RES. 2021-R013, scheduled to be introduced for expedited consideration later that evening. Councilor Larson stated her support for improved traffic and pedestrian safety in the city, especially near schools.

Vice President Ellen Robertson requested to be added as a co-patron of RES. 2021-R012, and shared her condolences to the family of Aajah Rosemond. Vice President Robertson also requested that Council be responsive to the need to improve infrastructure in the city.

Councilwoman Reva Trammell shared her condolences to the family of Aajah Rosemond. Councilwoman Trammell stated the Governor of Virginia and the Virginia General Assembly needed to provide the city with additional funding and resources to address necessary infrastructure improvements in the city.

Councilor Katherine Jordan requested to be added as a co-patron of RES. 2021-R012, and stated Council needed to help improve pedestrian safety in the city.

Councilor Ann-Frances Lambert requested to be added as a co-patron of RES. 2021-R012.

Councilor Andreas Addison requested to be added as a co-patron of RES. 2021-R012, and stated his support for reviewing potential changes that could be implemented to increase safety in the city.

President Cynthia Newbille requested to be added as a co-patron of RES. 2021-R012, and requested that Council review possible safety improvements at school locations in the city.

Public Hearing

Yesmine Bethea spoke in support of RES. 2021-R013, and stated that vehicle speed needed to be reduced in the area surrounding the intersection of German School Road and Jahnke Road.

Councilor Michael Jones stated that infrastructure needed to be improved in the city to increase safety for all citizens.

Councilwoman Reva Trammell stated that she would request Police Chief Gerald Smith to address the issue of speeding vehicles on Wamsley Boulevard at the next Public Safety Standing Committee meeting.

Councilor Andreas Addison stated that people driving vehicles in the city need to be made aware that roads must be shared with pedestrians and bicyclists.
