§ 1. PURPOSE:

To amend the City Code to provide for the assessment of an additional \$5.00 in each Juvenile and Domestic Relations (JDR) criminal or traffic case, pursuant to Virginia Code § 17.1-279.1. The funds are to be retained in a separate special fund designated as "Police eTicket Account" and used solely to fund software, hardware, and associated equipment costs for the implementation and maintenance of an electronic summons system. Also to amend the FY2020 special fund budget to appropriate \$15,000 in estimated revenue for these purposes.

REASON:

Section 17.1-279.1 of the Code of Virginia, as passed during the 2014 Session of the Virginia Acts of Assembly, authorizes the local governing body to adopt an ordinance that will assess up to an additional \$5.00 as part of the costs in each criminal or traffic case in the locality's district or circuit courts. The funds are then held for disbursement to fund software, hardware and

system. An electronic summons system will reduce the time it takes an officer to issue a traffic citation. This will reduce the risk of road shoulder accidents during the course of the officer's traffic stop, as well as provide the motorist with a faster, more efficient transaction.

On October 8, 2018, a public hearing was held regarding the assessment of a \$5.00 fee for all criminal and traffic cases in the General District Court and the Circuit Court of the City of Richmond. By a vote of 9-0, the City Council adopted the ordinance, adding section 12-122 to the Code of the City of Richmond. Currently, the ordinance does not cover any criminal or traffic cases in the Richmond JDR District Court. Authorizing the assessment of an additional \$5.00 fee in each JDR criminal or traffic case would bring the Richmond JDR District Court in line with the other Richmond courts.

RECOMMENDATION:

The City Administration recommends adoption of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND:

The Richmond Police Department (RPD) promotes traffic safety and enforces traffic code violations on a daily basis. During 2017 and 2018, RPD issued, on average, 47,111 traffic citations per year and made, on average, 15,562 arrests. When motorists are stopped by police, it adds an element of danger as the motorists and officers are exposed to passing traffic. Nationwide statistics indicate that in 2017, there were a total of 31 officer fatalities caused by motor vehicle crashes, and 10 officer fatalities caused by the officer being struck by a vehicle. An electronic summons system will reduce the danger of road shoulder accidents by reducing the amount of time it will take an officer to issue a traffic citation. Additionally, an electronic summons system will provide the motorist with a faster, more efficient transaction.

An electronic summons system will also significantly improve efficiency and accuracy in the process of issuing citations. Citation data will automatically be scanned and electronically entered at the point of activity. Personnel will no longer have to subsequently re-enter data from hand-written tickets. Once the citation is completed, the transaction data will be sent electronically to the court's case management system, usually within 24 hours or less. This will allow violators to promptly prepay their fines, as well as aid the courts in managing their dockets and tracking their caseloads. Additionally, the electronic summons system will reduce data entry errors, thereby reducing the need for manual ticket information follow-ups between the courts and police.

Funding from the proposed ordinance will also support the purchase of new peripheral equipment such as handheld devices, portable printers, driver's license scanners, and barcode readers. This equipment will contribute to making the citation process run faster and more efficiently. Vehicle operators will still receive a paper copy of the summons printed locally by the officer.

The initial implementation would cover 25 vehicles. However, the full implementation of an electronic summons system will cover approximately 400 police vehicles. The City of Richmond is currently in the process of procuring such a system.
