ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY

Patrons request that legislation be drafted requesting that Chief Administrative Officer develop have a map or digital connectivity assets including "vertical assets" that are - or could be – utilized for telecommunications purposes and are controlled by the city. Further, the map shall contain all city-owned or city-controlled fiber assets, with notation of any restrictions or covenants governing such assets. This map will be used to develop plans to expand high speed internet connectivity for all City residents. Patrons further requests that the draft be substantially as follows where possible:

Whereas the City Council believes that all Richmond residents should have reliable and affordable high speed internet access in their homes, schools, parks, and communities;

Whereas the City Council recognizes that market failures have resulted in the exclusion of lower-

income communities, particularly Black and Brown families, from a rapidly changing digital society and economy; Whereas the City Council affirms its support for the goals of the Commonwealth of Virginia's Commonwealth Connect Plan, striving for universal broadband access across the state; Therefore be it resolved that the production of a map and including both vertical assets and the City's existing fiber network is necessary for the City to build a strategy for providing universal broadband access across the city. BACKGROUND Federal, state, and local governments are increasing making efforts to increases high speed internet access and work to lower its costs. Governor Northam announced plans to make federal CARES Act funding available to localities in Virginia. While Richmond did not apply and receive fund for those monies patrons hope that digital mapping will assist the City in being eligible for future funding.
