I have significant public budgeting expertise. I earned my graduate degree in Public Policy at the University of Virginia and studied state and local budgeting as part of my coursework. I also have extensive professional analyzing Virginia's budget, which has provided me a strong understanding of how local budgets are shaped by federal and state policy decisions. For instance, I am very familiar with the budget process beginning with agency requests through final adoption. I am also very familiar with different types of public budgeting, such as performance-based budgeting.

I have also spent significant time analyzing Richmond's current and previous budgets, ordinances, and statutes to identify opportunities to help its residents. Two years ago, I used federal census and City data to conclude that up to 75% of residents eligible for the City's Real Estate Tax Relief program were not enrolled. I shared these findings with the public in an interview with VPM and met with City staff to discuss recommendations to boost enrollment. I followed up six months later with second analysis to determine the number of residents who became newly eligible due to an expansion of the program.

I have also worked – admittedly in fits and starts – on a bigger project to create a Richmond “budget-tracker” that would allow the public to easily compare current budget amounts across budget years. I reviewed the past five Richmond budgets to outline how best to make these comparisons, and I hope to finish the project and make it available. Regardless, the experience has taught me about the different ways the City measures

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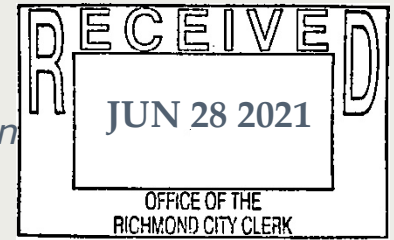

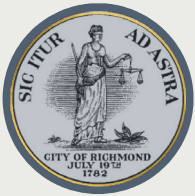
I am aware of participatory budgeting because I know that Seattle, where I used to live, has had participatory budgeting programs through various city departments including the Department of Neighborhoods. This program successfully completed improvement projects around the city, particularly in communities that are typically underserved or where certain improvements would have clear and outsized benefits to the neighborhood.

I also supported building a structure that would eventually lead to participatory budgeting in an organization whose board I sat on. My role was to support the creation of an organizational budget that could eventually have input from members of the organization such that different members of the organization and re-granting organizations could share their views and vote on where they wanted to see our funds go.

This was an organization that raised funds which were re-granted to partner organizations, but there were times when the board made decisions about how much money was granted and to whom without a lot of input from our community or the community organizations we were funding. Our lack of clarity and transparency, while never questioned, made us want to find a better way.

I work as a community organizer, and in this capacity, both paid and unpaid, I have spent many years working to elect leaders for and from historically under-represented communities, pass policy that benefits low-wage workers, especially domestic workers, and support budgets that prioritize people, affordable housing, public health, and environmental justice.

My paid work is with Hand in Hand, where I organize employers of nannies, home attendants, and house cleaners in support of policy campaigns to pass Domestic Workers Bills of Rights around the country, including here in Virginia. I work in close coalition with the National Domestic Workers Alliance and affiliate organizations, typically comprised of domestic workers and local organizers.

I have been part of community organizing in an unpaid capacity both in Richmond and in other parts of the country around electoral politics and community support. In Seattle, I sat on the board of the Coalition of Anti-Racist Whites, where we fundraised for re-granting to local Black and brown-led organizations including the creation of the Real Rent campaign (realrentduwamish.org), which has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for the Duwamish Tribe, which still lacks federal recognition.

Our work in Seattle depended on deep solidarity and trust: we were able to create and maintain programs like Real Rent only because Tribal elders, CARW members, and the broader community trusted CARW to steward the program. Similarly, CARW acted as a pass-through organization for campaigns, supporting the Black Lives Matter movement last summer and the Trans Women of Color Solidarity Network, as these organizations developed infrastructure, including bank accounts.

In Richmond, I have begun organizing with local formations including Mutual Aid RVA and Southerners on New Ground, both organizations that are building toward a vision of interdependence and care through direct service.

So much service work suffers from lack of resources, and the scarcity is felt most keenly by our Black and brown neighbors. By creating programs that allow transparent, trusted financial stewardship and encourage generous giving, the organizations I support with my labor have become crucial in the ongoing struggle for rights and protections as well as policy and culture change. I'd be glad to bring those skills to the Participatory Budgeting Steering Commission.

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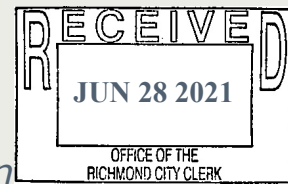

I lived in two cities abroad that had robust participatory budgeting programs with promotional materials at bus stops and on public buildings. When I got my master's in urban planning with a focus on community planning and engagement I made participatory budgeting the topic of my thesis. I compared and contrasted participatory budgeting processes in New York City, Berlin, and Yogyakarta, Indonesia in order to determine which policies and frameworks encouraged the highest participation from the public in terms of both idea submission as well as voting. That work earned me a position with the Green Party in Berlin wherein I monitored and evaluated seven city districts' PB processes over the course of a year and a half. Based on a review of PB engagement practices, interviews with municipal and state government officials, and embedded participation in over a dozen local voting processes, I submitted a report to the Speaker for City Planning in the state legislature to improve Berlin's PB and increase public participation in it.
