ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY

The patron requests a Resolution asking that 60% of the funds the City receives from the American Rescue Plan Act be allocated to Southside projects and projects in neighborhoods where communities of color have been historically disinvested from.

BACKGROUND

The City of Richmond is anticipated to receive \$115 million in federal relief dollars through the American Rescue Plan (ARP). Richmond will be receiving ARP funding both as a city and as a county due to its unique status as an independent city.

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (HR 1319) became law on March 11, 2021. The ARP was passed to assist individuals, families, small businesses, and localities in weathering the economic fallout for the COVID-19 pandemic.

Before the City of Richmond will receive and begin utilization of its ARP funding, the funds much first pass through and be allocated by the State of Virginia. At this time, the date of the disbursement of funds to the City of Richmond is unknown.
