Task Force for the Establishment of the Civilian Review Board: Recommendations

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Work of the Task Force

- Examine police oversight models in other jurisdictions and identify best practices
- Examine relevant state and local laws regarding police oversight
- Gain insight from local and national experts
- Held weekly public meetings
- Gather stakeholder input

Stakeholder Input

- Community outreach
 - Survey
 - Town Halls
 - Canvassing
- Engage with non-profit and civic organizations
- Meetings with public officials, police, and criminal justice agencies

Do we need independent oversight of the police?

- Survey Says...
 - o **54%** Yes
 - o 31% No
 - o 15% Neutral/Undecided/No Opinion
- Comment themes:
 - Law enforcement needs to be **accountable to the community** it has sworn to protect and serve
 - The police already have a citizen review board, Internal Affairs
 - If the CRB can perform their duties without interference from state and local politicians then it may be a good idea

What are resident concerns about the police handling the complaint process?

- RPD has demonstrated systemic issues with treating citizens consistently and fairly
- The current setup lacks transparency
- The police department needs to be accountable to the citizens it serves

What do community members want oversight to look like? (scope of powers)

- What powers should the CRB have? Survey Says...
 - 18% Subpoena documents about prior discipline history
 - 21% Require access to evidence such as body camera footage
 - 19% Ability to audit data and produce reports
 - o 25% Review policy and make recommendations on best practices
 - 18% Make recommendations for discipline
- Comment themes:
 - Recommendations are not enough must be able to enforce
 - The CRB should **do just that Review**


Other Stakeholder Input

Recommendations

- Independently Receive and Investigate All Complaints
 - Subpoena Power
 - Intake of Previous Complaints
- Make Binding Disciplinary Decisions
- Review RPD Policy and Make Policy Recommendations
- Auditing Police Data and Make Public Reports
- Review RPD Budget and Make Budgetary Recommendations
