THE CITY OF RICHMOND HEREBY ORDAINS:

§ 1. That Article I, Section 1 of Ordinance No. 2023-071, adopted May 8, 2023, which adopted a General Fund Budget for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024, and made appropriations pursuant thereto, is hereby amended by:

- (a) Creating the following new line items in the Non-Departmental agency:

- (1) ARPA - OOS - Bridging the Gap in Virginia - Community Garden enhancement;
- (2) ARPA - OOS - James River Association - Greening Richmond Public Libraries;
- (3) ARPA - OOS - Church Hill Association of RVA Inc. - Tree Planting and Maintenance;

§ 2. This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon adoption.
