



Legislation Text

To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept funds in the amount of \$20,104,653.00 from the Commonwealth of Virginia; to amend the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Special Fund Budget by creating a new special fund for the Department of Fire and Emergency Services called the COVID-19 Relief Special Fund; and to appropriate the increase to the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Fire and Emergency Services' COVID-19 Relief Special Fund by \$20,104,653.00 for the purpose of funding necessary expenditures due to the public health emergency with respect to the COVID-19 pandemic.

THE CITY OF RICHMOND HEREBY ORDAINS:

§ 1. That the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, is authorized to accept funds in the amount of \$20,104,653.00 from the Commonwealth of Virginia for the purpose of funding necessary expenditures due to the public health emergency with respect to the COVID-19 pandemic.

§ 2. That Ordinance No. 2019-042, adopted May 13, 2019, which adopted a Special Fund Budget for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, and made appropriations pursuant thereto, be and is hereby amended by creating a new special fund for the Department of Fire and Emergency Services called the COVID-19 Relief Special Fund for the purpose of funding necessary expenditures due to the public health emergency with respect to the COVID-19 pandemic.

§ 3. That the funds received are hereby appropriated to the Special Fund Budget for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, by increasing estimated revenues by \$20,104,653.00, increasing the amount appropriated for expenditures by \$20,104,653.00, and allotting to the Department of Fire and Emergency Services' COVID-19 Relief Special Fund the sum of \$20,104,653.00 for the purpose of funding necessary expenditures due to the public health emergency with respect to the COVID-19 pandemic.

§ 4. This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon adoption.
