To designate the 200 block of East Clay Street in honor of Jack Green.
THE CITY OF RICHMOND HEREBY ORDAINS:

§ 1. **Designation of Street Block for Honorary Name.** The 200 block of East Clay Street shall be designated in honor of Jack Green, pursuant to this ordinance.

§ 2. **Effect of Designation.** The designation of the street block made pursuant to this ordinance shall be honorary only, shall not replace the existing name of the street, and shall have no effect on the address of any property with an address on the designated street block. The sole effect of designation pursuant to this ordinance shall be to authorize the placement of commemorative signs in accordance with this ordinance memorializing the designation in honor of the named person.

§ 3. **Administration of Ordinance.** The Department of Public Works shall implement this ordinance by installing, as soon as practicable after the adoption of this ordinance, and maintaining commemorative signs in accordance with this section. The commemorative signs shall be clearly distinct from the street signs used to identify the street block in question such that a reasonable person could not conclude that the commemorative signs reflect the actual name of the street. The commemorative signs (i) shall be affixed to a sign pole installed at each end of the block designated in section 1 of this ordinance for the purpose of fulfilling the requirements of this section or to any existing sign identifying the road designated in section 1 of this ordinance located at each end of the block designated in section 1 of this ordinance and (ii) shall bear the name of the person set forth in section 1 of this ordinance.

§ 4. **Effective Date.** This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon adoption.

PURPOSE:

Designating the 200 block of E. Clay Street, located between N. 2nd Street and N. 3rd Street in honor of the late Jack Green.

BACKGROUND:

Jack Green was founder and publisher of the Voice Newspapers which was last headquartered on this block. He co-founded the paper with his wife Ruby. The paper followed a long tradition of independent black newspapers in Virginia and was published in Richmond, Southside Virginia, and in Hampton Roads.

In his early career Mr. Green was Marketing Director of GRTC. He served his country in Vietnam while in the US Air Force. Mr. Green also served as a long-time member and as a Chairman of the Nottoway County Board of Supervisors.

The patron requests that the block on southside of the of E Clay Street bear the honorary designation and that signage be installed on that side of the street.
